- Plans to have Parish wide zoom meetings 2X a week for Advent
- Led brainstorming on what Christmas worship will look like, much discussion

## To help everyone share in the "light of the season" we are offering **"Advent Wreaths**" to purchase for your home!

The first candle symbolizes hope. Three of the Advent candles are blue symbolizing royalty, hope, and Mother Mary (often portrayed wearing blue). Hope is the main theme of Advent, the beginning of the Church year. We wait in expectation for the coming Messiah!

The second candle represents peace as a homage to the angels' song. It is called the Bethlehem Candle as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's arduous journey to an insignificant town—but their actions will bring peace to ALL the earth! The third candle is pink for Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of Joy. Because Advent is a penitential season, it has a lot of similarities with Laetare Sunday (4th Sunday in Lent, also pink). It is as if the Church cannot contain its excitement and needs to have one day of celebration during the somber and austere season.

The fourth candle is again blue, bringing us back to our meditative states where we ponder, along with Mother Mary, all the things in our heart. That is, of course, why the theme for the final Advent Sunday is love. John 3:16 sums it up well.

The tallest candle in the middle is white and it represents Jesus Christ, the light of the world! We light this candle the night of Christmas Eve as we keep vigil for the birth of Christ! When all the candles are burning, we see an impenetrable force: the hope, peace, joy, and love of God! The light which no darkness can overcome! Alleluia!
