

He did tell us however that there would be bill coming in before the end of the month so that he was hoping by the month's end he was hoping to be around \$1,000 to \$2000 to the plus side. He thanked all for the additional contributions and for stepping up, we have had a few sizable generous donations. KEEP IT UP!!

*SIgn and Sound System Update - President Rick Kosloski gave an update on the LED Sign that we are looking to purchase with the Memorial Fund Money. The family told us to get a quality sign and we have only had one bid come in so far which was substantially higher than what we wanted to spend. We are taking the project slowly and responsibly to make sure we make the best decision not only for the church but for the family of the Memorial Fund.

*The Book Club and Randy Ellis have donated some money toward a new Sound System. Jenelle Lindquist is looking into different options, and checking with other churches, in hopes to minimize the equipment that we have here, as there is quite a bit of ours that doesn't work.

They meet Wednesday mornings at 9am – for fellowship & fun!





The ELCA affirms the ancient understanding that one need not completely understand the sacrament before receiving it (it's impossible anyway!). Holy Baptism makes one a full member of the Body of Christ. Therefore, it is not unheard of to commune people of ALL ages, even babies. However, we understand that this is not the norm--especially in our region. While we encourage families to have First Communion around the 4th grade, it is ultimately the parent's decision. When it is believed that the children are "ready" to partake, it will be formally acknowledged and celebrated during a Sunday worship.

Perhaps you never formally had "First Communion." That's ok! Those wishing to learn more about Holy Communion, as well as families who wish to have their children undergo formal instruction, are welcome and encouraged to talk to Pastor Emily!

Your donation (packed in a brown paper bag) is due to the church by Friday Nov. 10th.


