A NOTE FROM PASTOR DUANE

After her stroke and a stay in rehab, my mom moved in with us. She is adapting quite well to the deficits the stroke left her with; however, there is one deficit Mom has that is not a result of the stroke. She has had this problem for quite some time. It is a problem most of us have as we get older. She is a little hard of hearing. In fact, the audiologist says she has a 55% hearing loss. So, when I go in her room in the mornings and try to ask her how she slept, she sometimes gives me a grin and a blank stare. Then I do what any loving child would do for their parent, I pick up her hearing aids and hand them to her before I ask another question. I know this sounds funny, but to the person who has trouble hearing, it is not.

Since moving to Ringgold, I have been taking her to the Miracle Ear office in Danville to get her hearing aids checked. They discovered she had the wrong filters and covers for her hearing aids. They cleaned the hearing aids, fitted them properly, and she could hear great. A couple weeks later, the right hearing aid had no sound coming through. I took the device back to Miracle Ear and Maggie, the assistant at the office, checked out the hearing aid and discovered the filter was packed with wax. She replaced the filter, gave me more filters, and showed me how to change the filter out if it happened again.

Sure enough, after about two weeks Mom complained her right hearing aid was no longer working and wondered if she needed new hearing aids. I took the filters Maggie gave me, put a new one in the hearing aid, and voila, it was like brand new. Mom could hear from her right ear once again.

This made me realize why we have trouble hearing from God sometimes. We feel like He is not listening. We feel like He doesn't care. So, we complain that we can't hear God speaking to us. Maybe we need a new pastor, or a new church, or a new Bible? No, that is not the answer. It could be our filter is clogged and needs to be cleaned. So, how do we do that? The process is called confession and repentance. Confession is an admission or acknowledgment of sin. The Bible speaks a lot about confession and our relationship with God. 1 John 1:9 says, "if we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Proverbs 28:13 says, "He who covers his sins will not prosper, But whoever confesses and forsakes them will have mercy." 2 Chronicles 7:14, "if My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land."

As we read our Bible and pray, God will speak to us revealing those things we need to confess. These are sins God already knows about. He just wants us to acknowledge them and repent. Repent simply means after confessing sins, we turn away from them. That is how we are cleansed and how we hear God's voice again. Maybe we can pray the prayer David prayed in Psalm 51:10-12; "Create in me a clean heart, O God, And renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from Your presence, And do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation."

Need to clean your filter to hear God's voice again? Try confession. You'll be glad you did.


