# A WORD FROM PASTOR DUANE

As most of you know, my mom went back home to North Carolina this past week after living here in Ringgold for the past 9 months as she recovered from the stroke she suffered last Christmas Eve. I would like to thank everyone for the love they lavished on her while she was here. You made it hard for her to go back home because you treated her with such genuine care. But that's who you are as a church. I praise God for strengthening her to the point where she has regained a lot of her independence and was able to go back home for Thanksgiving and Christmas. As we celebrate Christmas and I think about my mom, I am reminded of a story I read recently.

Once there was a little boy who was really mean. No matter what his parents tried, he continued to be selfcentered, selfish, and-well-mean. Christmas was coming soon, so the little boy, in his usual selfish way, made his "Dear Santa" letter-twelve pages of gadgets and toys!

When his parents saw the monstrous letter, they were outraged. Father picked up the little boy and carried him to the living room, setting him firmly on the floor in front of the family's nativity scene. "I want you to sit right here and look at this scene until you remember what Christmas is all about. Then you must write a letter to Jesus,'

So the little boy sits there a while and then returns to his bedroom. Finding paper and pencil, he begins to write: "Dear Jesus, if you will bring me all the presents I want, I will be good for a whole year." Then he thinks for a moment and tears up the paper. He writes again: "Dear Jesus, if you will bring me all the presents I want, I will be good for a whole week." but once again he tears up the paper.

The little boy quietly leaves his room and returns to the living room, looking intently at the nativity scene. He gently reaches down and picks up the figure of Mary. Returning to his room, he places the figure in a shoe box and sets the box in the back of his closet. Then he writes another letter: "Dear Jesus, if you ever want to see your mother again...'

Just like us, Jesus had a mom too. Christmas is about the gift that God sent to us in His Son Jesus Christ. We give gifts to those we love. God gave us Jesus because He loves us. What an awesome gift! For Jesus to come, His mother Mary, had to submit to the will of God. God would not have forced Mary to give birth to Jesus, but gave her the opportunity to be the mother of the Son of God. She said, "Let it be according to Your Word." Mary loved her Son, but she had no idea what being His mother would entail, as she had to watch Him suffer, bleed, and die for the sins of all of us. Jesus died for us all that we might have eternal life. Jesus came that we may have life and have life abundantly.

Too many of us, like this little boy are not satisfied with what God gives us, so we have a tendency to try to bargain with God to get what we want. We scheme and we bargain, but that is not how God operates. He doesn't deal with threats or kidnapping demands. He simply wants us to love Him and He takes care of our needs.

I am afraid too many people in our society have forgotten or just don't care what Christmas is about. There is too much selfishness and self-centeredness. People in our world today believe Christmas is about the gifts, food, and parties. Too many are like this mean little boy, and they try to scheme their way into getting what they want. It's not about what we want, it's about what we need. People don't care about the sacrifice given in order for them to have the best gift.

As we celebrate Christmas, remember Jesus was born to be the Savior of the World. That is the gift God gave us. The gift He wants from us - is us. Let's honor Him, love Him, and remember Him this Christmas season. Let's be like Jesus' mother and allow God to use us for His glory and His purpose. Merry Christmas.
