

A NOTE FROM PASTOR DUANE

My mom had a pacemaker implanted over 13 years ago to control the rate of her heart. The doctor who installed the pacemaker told her the battery should last about 10 years. Some 18 months ago she was told the battery would probably need to be replaced around September of last year but couldn't be replaced until it was completely dead. They also informed her that after the battery died completely, there was a 3 month back up battery that would pace her heart until the new battery could be installed; however, the pacemaker would run in a different mode during that period. She has been anticipating this event to take place for about a year. Each month, since last March, the battery has been checked and the reports would say it had less than a month left, which was very worrisome. Finally, last month, in the middle of October, the battery went caput. The mode did change the rhythm of her heartbeat. This created dizziness, weakness, nausea, and other unpleasant effects. The good news is she got a brand-new battery near the end of October. Her heart is now pacing properly, and all those unpleasant effects went away.

When we are saved by the grace of God, through the blood of Jesus, by faith, we are given a heart transplant. That new heart comes complete with the power of the Holy Spirit to pace our heart to the beat God desires for it to operate. In Ezekiel 36:26-27, God says, "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will remove your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. I will place my Spirit within you and cause you to follow my statutes and carefully observe my ordinances."

That power of the Holy Spirit is permanent and will never be depleted. Even when we feel weak, He will give us strength. The Bible gives us assurances of His empowerment. In Acts 1:8, Jesus says, "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you." In Philippians 4:13 Paul says, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." In Isaiah 40:29, the prophet says, "He gives power to the weak, and to those who have no might He increases strength."

So why do we still feel weak and inadequate sometimes? Why do we feel our heart is not pacing with God's desire for our lives? The Bible says we need to be filled with the Holy Spirit. In other words, our spiritual tank begins to run low. It will never run empty or be completely depleted, but it runs low and needs to be filled. Our spiritual tank runs low because sometimes it gets contaminated with the things of this world, and our heart begins to function sluggishly. Once we are filled with the Spirit, the Holy Spirit pushes all those contaminates out and our hearts will pace properly again.

So how can we be filled with the Holy Spirit? When our car's tank runs low, we go to the gas station for a fill up. If you have an electric car you plug into a charging station for a full charge. Ephesians 5:18 says, "don't get drunk with wine, which leads to reckless living, but be filled by the Spirit." In other words, don't fill your lives with useless things and useless living, but live for Jesus. Spend whatever time you can studying God's Word, praying, and attending worship and Bible study. Focus on the things of God and you will notice the contaminates dissipating and the fullness of the Spirit controlling your life.

Jesus says in Luke 11:13, "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" In other words, simply ask. James 4:2-3 says, "You do not have because you do not ask. "You ask and don't receive because you ask with wrong motives, so that you may spend it on your pleasures." Jesus says in John 16:24, "Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full." In Acts 13:52, Dr. Luke writes that "the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit." Being filled with joy and the Holy Spirit seem to run hand in hand. So, ask God to fill you with His Spirit and your joy will be full along with your spiritual tank. Then, your new heart will pace perfectly with God's will for your life. Do you need a fill up? Just ask.


