Today's Focus: Follow the Breadcrumb Trail of Hope

Have you ever felt lost? Ever feel like life has dropped you deep into the woods with no clear way out? In those moments, we don't want hints or small signs. We want answers, relief, and rescue right now. But in John 20, as grief-stricken followers approach Jesus' tomb, God doesn't give them everything at once. Instead, He leaves a trail, small, intentional "breadcrumbs" of hope: an empty tomb, folded grave clothes, and remembered promises. What seems insignificant at first is actually leading them to the greatest truth in history: Jesus is alive. In the same way, God still places breadcrumbs in our lives today—through His Word, His people, and His promises—guiding us from confusion and despair to the living hope found in the risen Christ.

ABOUT WORSHIP

Worship at Living Hope is designed to fill you with hope! The message you hear at Living Hope will center you on your Savior, Jesus, and what he's done for you. Worship isn't just about filling up God with praise. Worship is all about *God filling you* with good news!

We follow a basic order of service, called the liturgy. In the message, in specially selected Scripture readings, and in carefully crafted songs, prayers, and creeds, the liturgy proclaims the good news (gospel) about Jesus from start to finish. Gospel-centered worship is also designed to include participation of those in attendance.

Dear friends in Christ, today we come to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. Let us draw near to him in worship and praise, in our thoughts and in our prayers.

In every worship service we confess our sins then cling to the forgiveness that Jesus gives us. Confession is called the "heartbeat of the Christian."

Sermon Reading

John 20:1–18

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. ² So she left and ran to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. “They have taken the Lord out of the tomb,” she told them, “and we don’t know where they put him!”

³ So Peter and the other disciple went out, heading for the tomb. ⁴ The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and got to the tomb first. ⁵ Bending over, he saw the linen cloths lying there, yet he did not go in.

⁶ Then Simon Peter, who was following him, arrived and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there. ⁷ The cloth that had been on Jesus’ head was not lying with the linen cloths, but was folded up in a separate place by itself. ⁸ Then the other disciple, who arrived at the tomb first, also entered. He saw and believed. ⁹ (They still did not yet understand the Scripture that he must rise from the dead.) ¹⁰ Then the disciples went back to their homes.

¹¹ But Mary stood outside facing the tomb, weeping. As she wept, she bent over, looking into the tomb. ¹² She saw two angels in white clothes sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and one at the feet. ¹³ They asked her, “Woman, why are you weeping?”

She told them, “Because they have taken away my Lord, and I don’t know where they have laid him.”

¹⁴ After she said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, though she did not know it was Jesus.

¹⁵ Jesus said to her, “Woman, why are you weeping? Who are you looking for?”

Supposing he was the gardener, she replied, “Sir, if you carried him off, tell me where you laid him, and I will get him.”

¹⁶ Jesus said to her, “Mary.”

She turned and replied in Aramaic, “Rabboni!” (which means, “Teacher”).

¹⁷ Jesus told her, “Do not continue to cling to me, for I have not yet ascended to my Father. But go to my brothers and tell them, ‘I am ascending to my Father and your Father—to my God and your God.’”

¹⁸ Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, “I have seen the Lord!” She also told them the things he said to her.

2. Usually “we don’t like crumbs.” Where do you see that attitude in your own life?
3. In what ways do you tend to rush ahead to conclusions (like Mary or the disciples)?

4. Why is the resurrection the ultimate “breadcrumb” of every breadcrumb trail?
5. What would it look like to live this week as someone preparing for eternal life, not just managing earthly problems?
6. Share one promise of God (a “breadcrumb”) you can hold onto together this week.
7. Share one way you can become a “breadcrumb” of hope for someone else this week.



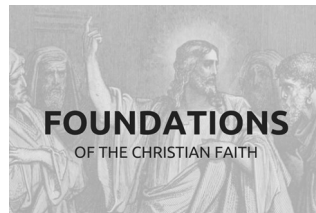
