Current Series: You Are My Witness

This series for the Easter season focuses on the Acts of the Apostles and their witness to the resurrection of Jesus. The witnessing of Christ didn't stop with those initial eyewitnesses. You and I today are called, too, to be witnesses of Christ by sharing that testimony and the joy and peace of salvation built on it.

Today's Focus: Ascension-Sharpener Focus

Even after Jesus' resurrection, his disciples still misunderstand the nature of his kingdom, looking for earthly glory and immediate victory. Then moments later, after Jesus ascends into heaven, they stand frozen with their eyes fixed on the sky. Their focus keeps drifting in the wrong direction. And honestly, so does ours. We can become consumed with earthly kingdoms we can build and control, or disconnected from the mission Christ has placed right in front of us. But in his ascension, Jesus sharpens the focus of his Church. The risen and reigning Savior redirects our eyes away from earthly distractions and idle sky-gazing and fixes them firmly on his kingdom, his mission, and his promise to return.

ABOUT WORSHIP

Worship at Living Hope is designed to fill you with hope! The message you hear at Living Hope will center you on your Savior, Jesus, and what he's done for you. Worship isn't just about filling up God with praise. Worship is all about *God filling you* with good news!

We follow a basic order of service, called the liturgy. In the message, in specially selected Scripture readings, and in carefully crafted songs, prayers, and creeds, the liturgy proclaims the good news (gospel) about Jesus from start to finish. Gospel-centered worship is also designed to include participation of those in attendance.

Sermon Reading

Acts 1:1–11

¹In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach ²until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. ⁴On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: “Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

⁶Then they gathered around him and asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?”

⁷He said to them: “It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes

on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”

⁹After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.

¹⁰They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. ¹¹“Men of Galilee,” they said, “why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven.”

2. Now that Jesus had risen what were the disciples likely hoping for?
3. How would this kingdom be different going forward?
4. What did the angels catch the disciples doing?
5. In what ways are we not much different from the disciples?
6. When our focus on Christ’s kingdom work is blurry what sharpens our focus?
7. Jesus’ ascension is not a departure. It is a _____.
8. In what way does God’s kingdom come?
9. Even when our eyes and hearts are unfocused, what is Jesus focused on?

Discussion questions:

(for Theology on Tap)

1. Which issue do you feel Christians struggle with more: spiritual nearsightedness or farsightedness? Which do you feel like you struggle with more?
2. Jesus responds to the disciples by redirecting them toward witness and mission rather than speculation about timing. Why is that correction important for the Church in every generation?
3. Jesus' ascension is not a departure but a coronation. Share how that strengthens your faith to know that the ascended Christ is reigning for his Church right now.
4. How does the ascension help balance both truths: #1. Christians are citizens of heaven #2. Christians are still called to serve faithfully in the world
5. Jesus still fixes his eyes on us in grace and reigns for us even when our focus wanders. Why is that gospel comfort so important before talking about mission and witness?

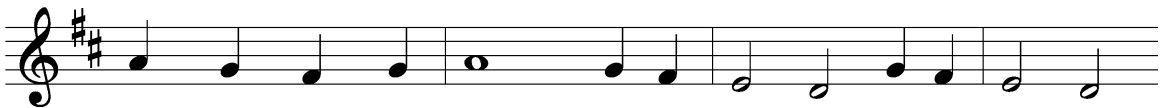

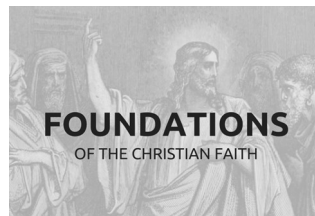
