Current Series: Undivided Attention

We live in a world where a thousand things are competing for our attention. There is the real danger that we focus on the frivolous and ignore the indispensable. As a result, we often talk about the importance of being "free from distraction." But the stakes are higher than that. We need to be *freed* from distraction. We need the spiritual power to give our undivided attention to that which truly makes a difference, not only here and now, but also in eternity. A life focused on all the right things is only possible because of a Savior who is always focused on us.

Today's Focus: Pulled in One Direction

At the root of the Biblical word "worry," is the idea of distraction, of being pulled in several directions at once. Can you relate? Our worry pulls us around and so often makes up the bulk of our day. We go from worrying about the first thing on our to-do list to having anxiety about the 10 other things at the end of the day we didn't cross off our to-do list.

But what if instead of being pulled in 10 directions throughout life, <u>you could instead be pulled in just one direction</u>? Does that sound appealing to you? Peaceful? Focused and purposeful? That's what Jesus is giving you today – a pull in one direction as the cure for worry and anxiety. This is a great way to wrap up our sermon series on Undivided Attention. Jesus is giving us one path to be pulled down, the path toward him and his kingdom, putting every other worry in its place.


ABOUT WORSHIP

- Everything you need to enjoy today's worship will be found in this Worship Folder. **Songs** will also be found on the screen.



⁸By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going. ⁹By faith he made his home in the promised land like a stranger in a foreign country; he lived in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰For he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God. ¹¹And by faith even Sarah, who was past childbearing age, was enabled to bear children because she considered him faithful who had made the promise. ¹²And so from this one man, and he as good as dead, came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand on the seashore.

¹³All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth. ¹⁴People who say such things show that they are looking for a country of their own. ¹⁵If they had been thinking of the country they had left, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶Instead, they were longing for a better country—a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

Children are invited to come forward into the front for the children's message. They will be given a special message designed just for them that ties in with the sermon.







Sermon Reading

Luke 12:22-34

²²Then Jesus said to his disciples: "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat; or about your body, what you will wear. ²³For life is more than food, and the body more than clothes. ²⁴Consider the ravens: They do not sow or reap, they have no storeroom or barn; yet God feeds them. And how much more valuable you are than birds! ²⁵Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life? ²⁶Since you cannot do this very little thing, why do you worry about the rest?

²⁷"Consider how the wild flowers grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. ²⁸If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today, and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, how much more will he clothe you—you of little faith! ²⁹And do not set your heart on what you will eat or drink; do not worry about it. ³⁰For the pagan world runs after all such things, and your Father knows that you need them. ³¹But seek his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well.

³²"Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. ³³Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. ³⁴For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

4. What's the deeper, spiritual danger of worry?
5. What is God's kingdom? How do we seek it?
6. Right after telling us to seek God's kingdom what does Jesus tell us God gives?
7. What two things Jesus says here can both be true?
8. In what way is worry like a fog?

Discussion questions:

(for Theology on Tap)

- 1. Share what some of your top 5 worries/concerns are. In what specific way does Jesus help you overcome that worry or put it in perspective?
- 2. What types of messages do you hear from the world about how to think about stress and anxiety? What types of messages do you hear from the world about how to take care of your own needs?
- 3. Discuss the difference between *worry* and *concern*. What types of things in life are acceptable to be concerned about even if you don't need to worry about them? List some examples of times when worry crosses the line into *sinful worry*.
- 4. Where do you draw the line between what is God's responsibility to handle and what is your responsibility to handle? Is it easy or difficult for you to let God take care of what you need?
- 5. In your own words, what does it mean to seek and receive the kingdom of God (v.31-32)?

We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.

Communion at Living Hope

Communion is important to us at Living Hope and we seek to honor the biblical view of *close communion*. Before coming up for communion, all adults should ask themselves these questions:

- 1. Do you confess your sins and seek to turn away from the sins you confessed?
- 2. Do you recognize that Jesus' sacrifice on the cross is the only way sin is forgiven?
- 3. Do you recognize that in the Sacrament you receive Jesus' true body and true blood along with the bread and the wine? (1 Corinthians 11:27-29 + 1 Corinthians 10:15-17)
- 4. Do you believe that the Bible *IS* God's inspired Word and does not just contain some truths of God?
- 5. Do you believe that Living Hope Lutheran Church teaches only the truth of God based on His inspired Word? (A summary of these teachings is taught in the *Foundations* course.)
