SERMON NOTES

Today in worship we continue with our year-long series called "The Bible Year," in which we are reading the Scriptures all the way through together, from cover to cover, from Genesis all the way through Revelation. We are currently reading the book of Ezekiel. Ezekiel was first a priest, and then a prophet, who addressed the people of Judah after the first wave of leading citizens had been deported to exile in the foreign land of Babylon. Ezekiel himself is one of the deportees, so he speaks from living in exile in Babylon.



Ezekiel is a strange figure: among other things, he has a wild vision in which he sees the glory of God departing from the Temple in Jerusalem. The prophet forecasts the imminent destruction of the city, as well as the coming judgment upon the people. But Ezekiel also sees a long term hope: one day, like a bunch of dry bones brought back to life, the people will be resurrected. One day, God's glory will return to a new and greater Temple. One day, God will become the people's leader and shepherd, and will live among them again.

Today's Scripture:

EZEKIEL 34: 1-6, 11-16, 20-25, 30-31 (NRSV) KEY VERSES:

"11 For thus says the Lord GoD: I myself will search for my sheep, and will seek them out. ¹² As shepherds seek out their flocks when they are among their scattered sheep, so I will seek out my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places to which they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. ¹³ I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land; and I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the watercourses, and in all the inhabited parts of the land. ¹⁴ I will feed them with good pasture, and the mountain heights of Israel shall be their pasture; there they shall lie down in good grazing land, and they shall feed on rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. ¹⁵ I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I will make them lie down, says the Lord GoD."
