

### **SERMON NOTES**

Today in worship we continue with our year-long series called "The Bible Year," in which we are reading the Scriptures all the way through together, from cover to cover, from Genesis all the way through Revelation. Currently we are finishing the Gospel According to Matthew, the first book of the New Testament. Matthew is one of four books of the Bible called "gospels" (the word "gospel" means "good news") which tell the life story of Jesus, based on the testimonies of eyewitnesses to his ministry. Today we read together the



last words of Matthew's Gospel, which are sometimes called "The Great Commission." With the Great Commission. Jesus sends his followers out with a mission to serve as his representatives to all people: a witness that our world needs now more than ever.

Matthew 28: 16-20 (NRSV) **KEY VERSES**:

16 Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. 17 When they saw him, they worshiped him, but they doubted. 18 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit 20 and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
