

SERMON NOTES

Today in worship we continue with our year-long series called "The Bible Year," in which we are reading the Scriptures all the way through together, from cover to cover, from Genesis all the way through Revelation. As we continue in the Gospel According to John, the fourth book of the New Testament, we recognize that John's gospel allows us to peer into the life of Jesus and get a sense about how his disciples struggled to understand some of their teacher's actions. All of Christ's teaching and



actions have a purpose and proclaim the very essence of his ministry. Jesus loved his disciples and he knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God. When he knelt before the disciples and humbled himself before them to wash their feet during the Passover meal, he demonstrated the importance of serving one another without reservation. This loving and selfless act of washing the disciples' feet can help us understand our role as Christ's disciples in the world today.

Today's Scripture JOHN 13:1-17 (NIV) KEY VERSES:

It was just before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.² The evening meal was in progress, and the devil had already prompted Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. ³ Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; ⁴ so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. ⁵ After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him..... "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. ¹³ "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. ¹⁴ Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. ¹⁵ I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you.
