# **SERVICE NOTES**

Today in worship we continue with our year-long series called "The Bible Year," in which we are reading the Scriptures, from cover to cover, from Genesis all the way through Revelation. Today also marks the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the Christian season of Advent. The word "Advent" means "Coming."



Advent is a season of four Sundays in which we prepare for the "coming" of God to us in Christ on Christmas, and look forward to the eventual "coming" of Christ's final victory. Today, as we continue in The Bible Year and in Advent, we are sharing an Advent mini-series called "The Christmas Letters." As we read through the Epistles that make up the last part of the New Testament, we are noticing the ways in which these letters point to the themes of Advent – and also to the birth of Jesus. Today's Letter comes from the Book of Hebrews in the Bible, and describes Jesus as the great mediator between God and human beings.

#### Today's Scripture:

Hebrews 1:1-4; 4:14-16(NRSV) *KEY VERSES:* 

"Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, <sup>2</sup> but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds.

<sup>3</sup> He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. . . . <sup>14</sup> Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. <sup>15</sup> For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who, in every respect, has been tested as we are, yet without sin.

<sup>16</sup> Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need."
