### Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends,

I will give thanks to you, LORD, with all my heart;
I will tell of all your wonderful deeds.
I will be glad and rejoice in you;
I will sing the praises of your name, O Most High. Psalm 9:1,2

During the summer months, there have been many great and marvelous ways that the people of GCUMC have touched children, families and individuals with Christ's love. I would like to tell of some of God's work through his church and offer praise to God and thanks to all those who have been serving in some way.

In June, the Vacation Bible School welcomed dozens of children to learn about God and have fun. The kids came from a variety of schools and backgrounds. In July, 25 kids had the opportunity to go to Camp Guilrock and thoroughly enjoy God's creation and the pool. Because of your giving, some of the children received scholarships and attended camp for the first time in their young lives! An effort was made for a hearing-impaired student to have an American Sign Language interpreter and as a result, this student benefitted from comprehending all of the Bible teaching, devotionals and instructions. Music camp for Elementary students was also offered in July and the kids participated in learning to play the ukulele and experimented with multiple musical mediums. In late July, a three day Summer Reading program was offered in which 40 kids registered and enjoyed meeting an author, getting books to take home each day, learning about Jesus Christ, friendship, compassion and kindness.

There have been meals on the lawn, trips to the Grasshoppers' baseball games, a trip to the Homeland Creamery with the JOY group and a church-wide Ice Cream Social. The Missional Network combined together to eat and fellowship together at Muir's Chapel where the Greensboro Cluster Choir blessed us with their songs of praise and thanksgiving.

Serving opportunities have abounded and there have always been enough volunteers. Convinced that our faith must result in actions of love and support for our fellow human beings, we are always open to serving God and community. Meals have been prepared and served at Potter's House, Pathways shelter for families and the Weaver House Shelter. Food was sorted at the Food Pantry at Greensboro Urban Ministry. Book and goody bags were prepared and given to the students who attended Arts Camp at Partnership Village. Items for outfitting homes for foster families were sorted and organized at Family Room Triad. Nine volunteers collaborated in the kayak cleanup as part of the Creation Care initiative at our church to clean up Lake Townsend. The dedicated volunteers hosted three blood drives in partnership with the Red Cross during June, July and August. The team that sets up homes for people who are transitioning into affordable housing have helped ten individuals or families this summer.

The Youth and Young Adults traveled to Western North Carolina to continue rebuilding and recovery efforts after Hurricane Helene's devastating flooding in the mountains. Three youth groups combined to serve many and connect with over a dozen United Methodist Churches.

These are just a few of the wonderful deeds of our Lord that are carried out as we strive to be instruments of faith, hope and love in this world. Give thanks to the Lord with your whole heart.

### **Creation Care Corner**

Want to learn more about our drinking water? Do you know from where your water comes? Where was your drinking water BEFORE you opened the faucet?

Kathleen Clay Edwards Family Branch Library is hosting, "Deep River Stories, Science, Stewardship, and Sustainability" on September 15, 2025, from 7-8pm. Let's explore the past, present and future of Deep River. (The Deep River is part of the Cape Fear River Basin and serves as a source of our drinking waters.) Discussion will cover contamination and how it affects the system and what is being done to address these issues; learn how you can get involved and otherwise be engaged in preserving and sustaining God's Creation of our water system.
