

### Tom's Note.....

Have you ever stood at the graveside of someone you loved? I have way too many times, and it always underscores the reality that for the deceased, life as we know it is over. When I stand by the grave of a friend, I may recall memories of that person – the good times we shared or the tough times we faced together. But I am always left with an empty feeling that he/she is gone, and there is nothing I can do to bring him/her back. Even if he belongs to God, filling me with the hope that I will see him/her again in the kingdom that is to come, I can't shake the feeling that our relationship is over. The followers of Jesus certainly knew this feeling.

The devious teachers of the law who put Jesus to death were convinced that he would never rise from the grave as he said he would. As much as they wanted to believe that Jesus would return, his followers were running low on hope. They had just experienced the saddest day of their lives. Death felt so final, and Jesus was gone. Forever. You can imagine their shock when they get to the tomb three days later, and the stone has been rolled away! You would think that, recalling all the times Jesus had told them he would die and then be raised, they would have jumped for joy. But that was expecting a lot after everything they had been through. Thankfully, an angel tells them what happened. The Roman soldiers had not stolen his body. Something far greater had occurred. "He is not here. He has risen, just as he said. Go quickly and tell his disciples." The disciples – those who knew him better than anyone – and yet, it took a while to unpack what they had experienced and what the angel had said.

While the message was directed to his disciples, it speaks clearly to anyone who has considered following Jesus. The resurrection of Jesus is what sets Christian belief apart from every other belief system on the planet. If the resurrection is true, God is unlimited in power. Skeptics and unbelievers can question and mock everything you might try to tell – but when a man comes back from the dead that is something different! This is the central and foundational spine of Christian belief. Jesus was dead and God raised him back to life – and here is the good news: His own victory over death gives everyone the same opportunity to live forever with God, which had been the plan from the beginning.

I know that death seems final. I've been by the grave too many times to ignore that. But the Christian faith says that death is not fatal. There is life after the grave; life better than we could ever imagine filled with the presence and power of God; a life when we will reunite with the saints who have gone before us. It is that promise that gives us hope. It is that promise that calls us to celebrate and sing. "Lives again our glorious king. Let all of heaven and nature sing."

See you on Resurrection Day – when new life is released and miracles happen!

### **Easter Mission Offering**

We have received some exciting news from Greensboro Urban Ministry. The food pantry will be going through a big change this summer. The traditional pantry will be

converted to a client choice model. Instead of picking up a bag of food that may or may not contain food the customer wants or needs, client choice pantries let customers tailor their food choices based on their own tastes, cultural background or dietary restrictions. This setup also represents a more efficient way to provide emergency food to people who need it, by integrating client feedback into purchasing and stocking decisions the pantry staff must make on a weekly basis.

To enable this to happen, valuable food storage space will be transformed into the Client Choice Pantry. This room currently stores pallets of food. Food Lion is generously donating the shelving for the pantry as well as stocking the shelves for the grand opening. Donations are still needed to fund the cost of a 3-door glass front refrigerator and a reach-in freezer. This Easter Mission Offering will be donated to the Food Pantry to aid in converting the old traditional food pantry to a client choice food pantry.

Checks with "EMO" in the memo line, cash offerings in marked envelopes or directed online donations between now and Easter Sunday will be counted towards our goal of \$13,000. This will provide the money needed to buy the refrigerator, freezer and help keep them stocked through the summer months, when the demands are greatest and the contributions fewest.
