Matt's Note

When I was growing up, it felt like Mother's Day was a holiday that was only outdone by Christmas and Easter for pomp, circumstance and attendance. Everyone was dressed to the nines, bedecked with flowers. Male pastors handed out presents for the oldest mom, mom with the most kids, etc. It is only in recent years that it has dawned on me just how many people have a difficult time with Mother's Day. So while we did celebrate Mother's Day in worship this Sunday, we tried to do so in a way that acknowledged the breadth of feelings people have about the occasion. There are so many in the room whose dreams for family didn't turn out as they had hoped.

Among the families having a difficult time this Mother's Day, one is certainly the family of Rachel Held Evans. Evans died last week at the age of 37, due to adverse drug reactions and complications following a bout with the flu and a UTI. She leaves behind a husband, Dan Evans, and children aged 3 and 1.

Rachel Held Evans grew up in a conservative evangelical home and attended college in Dayton, Tennessee – famous for being the home of the Scopes Monkey Trial. Some of Evans' experiences in college and beyond led her to question aspects of her faith background, but she never let go of her faith in Jesus, eventually settling into the Episcopal Church. She wrote four books, numerous blog posts and was a highly sought after speaker. For many people who felt like they were drifting farther and farther from the faith, she offered a lifeline.

Because she waded into many controversial subjects, Evans was a polarizing figure. But few would question her love for people, the way she tried to offer grace to people who felt left behind by the church and her integrity. Evans boldly called out faults and failings, especially her own.

Beth Moore wondered what "could cause many on other sides of issues to take their hats off to her in her death. People are run rife with grief for her babies, yes. But also I think part of it is that, in an era of gross hypocrisy, she was alarmingly honest."

Honesty really is the best policy, on Mother's Day and always. My hope for us in the church is that we'll be honest about our hurts and hopes, dreams and fears, disagreements and unity. May God's grace meet us right where we are and deliver us to where we need to be.

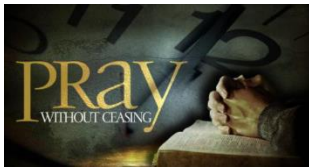

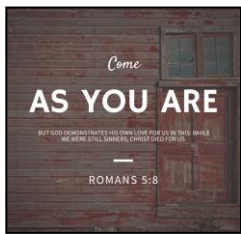

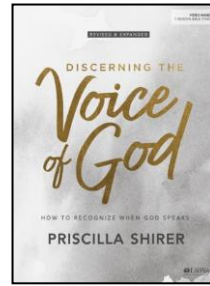
