Pastor's Pen

Dear Church Family,

Isaiah 9:6 (NIV)
For to us a child a born,
To us a son is given,
And the government will be on his shoulders.
And he will be called
Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

I looked back in our readings for the Bible Year that we began in January and we were reading Isaiah's prophecies back in July. Magrey R. DeVega writes in the daily reading guide that we have been using: "Isaiah chapters 8-11 contain many texts promising peace-texts that we are used to encountering in the season of Advent. But it also has hard images of crisis and pain. It's what the Israelites needed to change their views. It's nicer to be motivated by love, but sometimes crisis and pain are what push us to grow." In the Northern kingdom during that time the Israelites were being threatened by the Assyrians. God's covenant people in the southern kingdom had become dedicated to foreign gods and influenced by the culture of the times.

Isaiah's prophecies called the people to turn back to their Lord, the One God who had been faithful all through the years to their ancestors and to them. Isaiah offered hope for the future, a Messiah who could be trusted to set things straight and bring light and peace. In a similar way for us today, upon reading Isaiah's writings, we picture Christ Jesus who is victorious and capable of guiding us for all time. We can count on the great Teacher, the mighty One, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace.

I believe that as we read Isaiah's prophecies today, we can sense God calling **us** back to the relationship of love that is offered to us in Christ. Whatever is going on in the world, in our lives, our health, our families, or in our hearts, the truth is that Christ came to earth in human form to give us an option to be forgiven and become disciples of the true God. During Advent, we are encouraged to stop and consider the coming of the Messiah Jesus Christ so many years ago who came as a tiny baby to carry our burdens, to forgive us and set us free from the sins that weigh us down.

Bishop Carter has shared a prayer for each Sunday in Advent. The first one I read caused me to stop, dream, trust and hope. It is taken from Isaiah 2 and Matthew 24. I will share the prayer here:

"O God, we imagine climbing to a high mountain peak where we might see the world you dreamed of when you first began to create. There we will sit and feast with you, and we will not be alone. Friends and strangers from every nation will accompany us. There you will instruct us, you will resolve our disputes, you will purge the violence that has grown with us.

We want to be on this mountain peak with you, and yet we are not quite prepared for the journey. We confess that by now we should have been more prepared, but we are not.

So lift up our hearts, O Lord, to see a better future. Strengthen our weakened muscles, Soften our hardened hearts. Walk with us and lighten our darkness. Come, Lord Jesus. Amen." (Bishop Ken Carter, https://www.wnccumc.org/)

During this Advent season, let us take time together to stop, listen and wait as we pray, Come Lord Jesus, Come.

May your hearts and lives be filled with Christ's hope this Advent, Pastor Susan

- Established in 2002, Sanctuary House is a non-profit organization whose mission is to facilitate the recovery and rehabilitation of adults who experience symptoms of mental illness so that they may achieve and sustain satisfying, meaningful role and lives in our community.
- There is a \$50,000 matching gift opportunity for Sanctuary House for gifts received through Dec. 31.
