### Pastor's Pen

Dear Church Family,

An essential component of our Sunday worship is the time during the service when we offer the Prayers of the People and the Lord's Prayer. When we also have a call to prayer with a short song or chorus that guides us into the time of dialogue with our Lord, it makes it especially meaningful to me. Lifting up the names of those we love and are concerned about, those who we feel inclined to pray for, allows us to pray for them as a congregation and to carry them in our hearts and minds even after we leave the service. You might take note that there is a part in the bulletin where many of the names are printed as well. Some people use the blue attendance pads to write to the pastors about a prayer concern and these are usually read on Mondays. You might have noticed that there is a heart shaped wooden prayer bowl on a shelf in the Narthex. It is placed there for anyone who might like to write a prayer concern on a small card that is available next to the bowl and place it in the wooden heart. The pastors will check the bowl for prayer cards on Wednesdays before we go into noontime prayer.

Praving for others is called intercessory p

Praying for others is called intercessory prayer. There are many examples of God's people interceding for others throughout the Bible. The Prophet Isaiah (64:1,2) asks God to "tear open the heavens and come down so that the mountains would quake at the Lord's presence." Isaiah asks God to make the name of the Lord known to the adversaries and he prays that the nations might tremble at the very presence of the Creator. Isaiah prays that although the people have done wrong and turned away from God, may the Lord have mercy, not to be exceedingly angry with the people. Isaiah pleads for God to move in a mighty way to save his people and that it may reach all people from whatever country, language group or culture. I sense that Isaiah understands the dire circumstances of humanity but also has the hope and faith that The Almighty can rescue us from our sin.

This week we will begin reading the Prophet Jeremiah who will offer lament, pairing it always with hope, so that the people of Israel who lived during turbulent times, which included the fall of Jerusalem to the Babylonians and the exile of God's people to Babylonia, would find strength and deepen their faith. During Jeremiah's time of prayer, he also must listen for the words of the Lord. God said to Jeremiah (32:27) "I am the Lord, the God of all flesh; is anything too hard for me?" God's promises to the people include that "They shall be my people and I will be their God. I will give them one heart and one way, that they may revere me for all time, for their own good and the good of their children after them. I will make an everlasting covenant with them, never to draw back from doing good to them; and I will put the fear of me in their hearts, so that they may not turn from me." (Jeremiah 32:38-40) God invites us to pray and talk with him, he said to Jeremiah, "Call to me and I will answer you, and will tell you great and hidden things that you have not known." (Jeremiah 33:3)

As we intercede for those who are hurting, those who need wisdom, those who are in leadership and those who are lonely, let us listen and remember some of God's promises to keep the everlasting covenant that was given to us in Jesus Christ, that the Lord will do good and be faithful to us and our children and the coming generations. Let us be invited into conversation with our Holy Creator and trust that there can be sense made of some of the suffering and challenging circumstances that we are experiencing. Continue to lift up the names of others and share these needs with the Lord. We covenant to pray together with you following the example of the saints who have gone before us trusting that God will act in power and might.

May our hearts be unified in Christ, Pastor Susan
