#### Pastor's Pen

Dear Church,

Imagine that every morning, when you wake up, you are handed a full pitcher of water. The water in the pitcher represents your life, all that is given to you: not only your time, your talents, and your treasure, but also your thoughts, your energy, and perhaps most importantly, your attention.

All day long, as you carry your daily pitcher, you encounter many empty cups into which you can choose to pour that precious water from your supply. Imagine the empty cups are labeled things like WORK, SPOUSE, WORRY, CHILDREN, EMAIL, EATING, EXERCISE, CHURCH, NEWS, FAMILY, REGRET, SCROLLING, FRIENDS, PRAYER, RECREATION, SHOPPING, PEOPLE IN NEED.

Now imagine that, given the limitations of your container, you only have as much water each day as you find in your pitcher. On many days the pitcher is completely full, while on others perhaps it is only half-full — each day is a little different. And as you go throughout your day, you can only pour water out of your pitcher into one cup at a time — that's how a pitcher works. But otherwise, for the most part, you have a great deal of freedom to choose which cups you pour your water into.

The challenge, of course, is to pour our daily supply of water into the right cups – into the cups which are truly best for us and most important to us. Choosing the right cups is really difficult – it requires us to be thoughtful and intentional. In the words of Derek Thompson, too many people "spend hours, days, and even decades watering cups that they were never meant to water, and leaving empty other vessels that they always meant to fill."

What labels are on the cups around you? Which of these cups are most important to you? In your life right now, at the end of the day, which of the cups around you are the most full? Which have you honestly poured the most of your physical and mental energy and attention into? Which cups have been given only a drop or two? Which cups have been neglected and sit dehydrated, or even empty altogether?

Examining what we've done with our pitcher, and noticing which cups we've given the most attention to, offers us a kind of diagnostic test of what our true priorities are. After all, another name for where we direct our pitcher is "stewardship."

There is a beautiful Gospel hymn which is also a kind of prayer – the words go, "Fill my cup, Lord – I lift it up Lord." The hymn expresses the truth that God is always pouring into us, providing us with living water, handing us a new pitcher of love and life each day.

But there is a second prayer we need to pray, after we have prayed for God to fill our cup. That prayer is, "Lord, where would you have me pour the love and life you have given me today? What cups would you have me fill?"

Today God has filled your pitcher once again- what will you do with it?

May your cup runneth over – and may God make us all faithful and generous stewards of the water of life we've been given.
