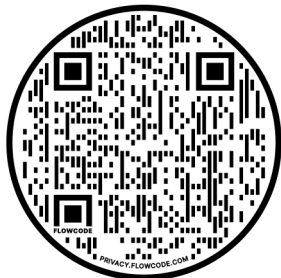

Growing Up in Christ

(Ephesians 4:1-17)

Paul has laid the groundwork through prayer and instruction to get to the implications of what he has said in the first three chapters of Ephesians. We will see in chapter five that there were congregations under some stress and threat. "Look carefully then, how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise . . . because the days are evil." (5:15). I believe that what we read here should be read in that context.

I recall a discussion with one of my professor/mentors many years ago concerning my frustration with churches I thought I understood in a different country. I didn't understand why they weren't doing some things I thought they should be doing. His response was that they were probably in survival mode. They were doing what they could with limited resources in a society that was not friendly to their cause. He was right. And those churches are still there. They are doing fine and many of them have grown over the years.

I believe that one of our challenges here is that we do not feel an existential threat that is constantly hounding us. We are not often pressed by forces outside that feel threatening to us. It is so easy to be a Christian that it is possible to remain childish for an entire lifetime. Some of us may have experienced a wonderful time in our Christian lives when we were part of something new or the church was growing. Thank God for those times but re-creating them is impossible using the same tools from years past.

It is necessary in our lives as Christians for us to grow. Growth means using what God has given us for the good of the church. Growth means continuing to study and learn and adapt. No church looks the same for fifty years and continues to thrive. Society changes, expectations change, and situations change. The power and beauty of the gospel is that it can move into any situation and transform it.

The text today begins with what we have been given, or maybe better our relationship to one another and to God. The series of "ones" at the beginning of chapter four is not something that we are to strive to get – it is what we are called to keep and keep in mind.

The gifts that we have been given are already here, among us. It is up to us to learn how to use them. It is up to us to encourage each other to use them. It is up to us to create space for those who are called to do a good work in the name of Jesus to have the room to do it.

Keeping what we have is not easy. It requires some things from us. It requires us to mature in Christ. Paul has more to say about this later, but in today's text he tells us that growing into the fullness of Christ will keep us focused and steady and stronger for the work we have to do.
