Do the Right Thing

(Mark 3:1-6)

I have known a couple of children in the past who were capable of doing something right in front of a group of people and without hesitation immediately deny that they had done it. In fact, there is a decent chance that I might have done that once or twice in my life, but I can't remember a specific instance – blocked that stuff out.

But I have seen more examples of children who, when they see someone who needs help, immediately give whatever assistance they can. There are also times when we might want to help, but are not quite sure what to do. This is where those of us who are adults come in handy. The easy examples concern things such as spilt milk. Hint, the first helpful action when someone spills milk is not laughter (which sometimes happens) or annoyance (which might be deserved), but rather limiting the damage. Then comes the cleanup and teaching how to be sure that it doesn't happen again.

This is an example of doing the right thing when someone makes a mistake. But there are other ways that we can challenge ourselves to do the right thing. Being a friend to people who need friends is the right thing to do. Just talking to people or sitting with them for a minute or two can make a big difference in someone's day at school. Thinking about others and how they might feel is good practice for learning how to be a leader and how to help others be better. It might even lead to being able to tell someone about Jesus.

Then there are times when doing the right thing might be really hard. We read a story about Jesus doing the right thing even when nearly everyone around him didn't want him to do it. It is a little risky to help people sometimes. Maybe like helping someone clean up a mess and it makes you late to class or getting in line. It might be that your teacher will not like it – at the very least you may have to explain yourself.

Jesus had met a man that had a withered hand and he couldn't use it. The problem was that it was the Sabbath. The religious leaders were just using this as an excuse to get Jesus into trouble. Jesus knew what they were thinking, so he called the man up to the front and healed him right before their eyes. He then asked them if they thought he had done the right thing. They didn't say a word. Instead they just went out and looked for ways to arrest him.

I remember a young man at this congregation, who told me that a student at school said he was an atheist. When he said it, other students started laughing at him and making fun of him and bothering him. The young man defended the atheist student because he had the right to believe that if he wanted to. He gained a friend and reminded (judged) the other students that they should not behave in such a way. Doing the right thing is not always easy – do it anyway.
