Walking in the Light of the Lord

(Romans 13:11-4; Isaiah 2:3-5; Psalm 122:1-9)

It's dark outside. Even on the sunniest of days at this time of year, the angle of the sun is low enough that the light is muted. There are shadows at midday. I find this light beautiful and calming but I feel like it is very late at 6:00 in the evening.

Walking in shadow and darkness is much harder than walking in light. Urgency and care that must be taken in the shadows that do not burden us in the daylight. We can't see as well or as far. It is no wonder at this time of year we surround ourselves with the light of candles and Christmas trees.

This is a time of waiting. We first wait for Christmas and the celebration of God coming to earth to dwell with us in the flesh. While waiting for advent is over after Christmas we continue to wait for the resurrection day. Some will use the time beforehand to prepare by giving up something by way of sacrifice. We know that as seasons come and go there is certainty to our waiting. We know the day will come.

The waiting we do as we walk with God is the same. Even though we may walk in a dark world, we walk as children of light. As Paul says in Romans, "Let us walk decently as in the day. . ." Our texts today encourage us to be a people who are going somewhere and we know where we are going. We are walking the way we do because we are preparing for the return of our king to execute righteous judgement on the world.

It is, I believe, possible for us to do this without condemning others. Light does not accuse, it exposes. The light of day helps us to see. It is true that those who walk "as in the day" (in the light) may repel those who prefer darkness. That is not the same as condemning.

Our world is inundated with choice and unhinged freedom. We are surrounded by people telling us that unless we make a difference, we are not worth as much as we could be. It has made many of us directionless. Worse, it is wandering without a clear moral compass or boundaries. It leaves us vulnerable to all sorts of theories and manipulations.

How different then, does it sound when a group of people can say, "Let us go up to the mountain of the Lord . . . that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." How hopeful does it sound that when we do this we will be able to "beat our swords into plowshares and our spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation."

Walking in the light with a clear direction and a clear teacher does not diminish our ability to choose from the good things in this life. It does not prevent us from being "successful" even by the world's definition. It will make us people who heal rather than harm. It will make us people who have clear vision and know the direction we are headed. It will make us unafraid to be disciples of the one on whom we are waiting with a sure hope.
