



He Will Come and Save You!

(Isaiah 35:1-10; Psalm 146:5-10; Luke 1:46-55; James 5:7-10)

Rescue comes in all shapes and sizes. From someone showing up near the end of a project with enough energy to help see that it is finished to an army freeing prisoners in labor camps. It may be as minor as helping lift a heavy object to saving a life. All rescue, when properly understood and received, produces gratitude in us.

I first went to Europe less than forty years after the conclusion of WWII. There were people in their sixties who were teenagers when the Nazis occupied their nations. They remembered the Americans (and others) who defeated their enemies and the helped rebuild their countries. All I had to do was start talking and that generation received me with gratitude. Salvation, true salvation, has staying power.

True salvation is also free. If a person needs rescue and has no means to pay or even to ask for help, the savior steps in because of the care they have for the one being rescued – whether they know them or not. There is a bond between people when one is saved, even if they never speak again.

I think it helps us to think about such powerful concepts as salvation, justice, and mercy in general as we consider what God has done for us and what he expects of us. I have done this in the past and realized that I may say that I believe in God, but I act as though I am an entitled child.

Our texts today are about the salvation of God. The prophet Isaiah told God's faithful children to "Be strong, and do not fear! . . . He will come and save you!" This salvation is more than saving our souls. It is also saving His people from the oppressors. It is helping His people bring about God's will on earth as it is in heaven. Salvation may be eternal, but it has power and consequences right now as we are living.

There are all kinds of things from which we need to be saved. There is not a person who has not been affected by the way they were raised. Even the best parents leave us with some things we need to learn to overcome. We may need to be saved from situations that cause us to live in fear. Most of us need to be saved from the idea that we can somehow save ourselves.

Being overwhelmed from time to time is part of what it means to be a human being. God's will is that we be rescued. He has given us His son to rescue us. He has given us His son as an example, a savior, an advocate, and a teacher. He has called his people, the church, the "called out", the rescued to reach out and play a role in saving others. Do not neglect the salvation that is freely offered to us. Do not neglect our dutiful response to the grace that has been poured out on us.

Salvation has staying power. Grace is attractive. Forgiveness frees us to admit we need help. Lives are changed – where there was once a dry wilderness there is now rejoicing and life.




