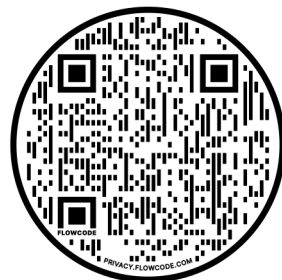

God With Us

(Isaiah 7:10-16; Psalm 80:1-7; Romans 1:1-7; Matthew 1:18-25)

Ahaz, the king, was worried. Israel (Ephraim) and Syria were in league against Judah and Jerusalem. God told Isaiah, the prophet, and his son Shear-Jashub to go and tell Ahaz that the attack would not succeed. He even told Ahaz to ask for a sign that God would deliver them. That sounds like good news, right?

Ahaz, however, had other ideas. He pulled a trick that so many still attempt today. He hid behind false piety to keep his options open. God, however, decides to send a sign anyway. It is the sign of another child (Isaiah's second child?) that will be named Immanuel (God with us). This is a remarkable move on God's part. Despite the fear and lack of faith of the king, God is demonstrating, yet again, that he is good for his promise that the house of David will not cease. And it happened. By the time the child was old enough to eat curds and honey, the threat had abated and there was, at least for a time, peace.

It is this text that Matthew quotes from when he describes the birth of Jesus in Matthew 1:18-25. Jesus' birth is a sign from God that the throne of David will once again be occupied. We will learn in the gospel story that it will not look like anyone was expecting – and it still doesn't. We see, however, that unlike the story in Isaiah, the parties that were involved believed and reacted in faith rather than fear. Joseph, Mary, Elizabeth, Zechariah (with a little help), the visitors from the east, Simeon, and Anna all met the event of Jesus' birth with faith.

What, then, does it mean to say "Immanuel" (God with us), or "Jesus" (God saves)? Most of the time I tend to think personally rather than communally. I may think about my own challenges and struggles, my own frailties and failings, or my own relationships or vocation. What, I believe, is meant in both Isaiah and Matthew is that God is with his people. If we add what the apostle Paul did with that message, we can say that God is with his people to "bring about obedience of faith among all the gentiles."

God is with us so that we can show him that he is with "all of us." God saves us from our enemies – sin, death, isolation, anxiety, lack of self-control. We may still struggle with these as we live our lives, but we are already rescued. I sometimes think we are like the person in the shallow end of the pool flailing about in fear when all that needs to be done is to stand up. That's what God does through Christ and that is what we can do for each other. Then we can learn how to swim.

God has restored us! He will restore us again when we need it! The king of heaven and earth is on the throne! Thanks be to God for his inexpressible love toward us. Thanks be to God for rescuing and restoring us. These words can seem far away, but they are not. Faith is the victory that overcomes the world.
