The Good King

(Isaiah 11:1-10; Psalm 72; Romans 15:4-13)

In the ancient world, everyone wanted a good and wise king. When there is a king, we all know to whom we can make an appeal. When there is a king, we all understand who the leader is and what is expected of citizens. The best kings are chosen by God and are expected to answer to the laws of God and seek after His wisdom.

The difference between the kings of Israel and other kings was that they all answered to God. Those who failed were removed (Israel) or punished (Judah). In the end, not enough of God's chosen kings were able to be righteous and just enough for his chosen people to be a light to the nations. Instead, his beloved people became a by-word – a warning that the God of Israel was God indeed.

Those who remained faithful were cared for by God and rose to positions of influence and were blessed by God – even in foreign lands. The stories of Daniel and his friends, Esther, and Nehemiah are testimonies of faithfulness in the face of difficulty. But God keeps his promises and he promised a king on David's throne that would fulfil the righteousness required to bring all nations into the fold.

This good king is from the "root of Jesse" and will restore righteous judgment, not based on what he sees and hears, but by wisdom given by God. He will not be partial to the poor or defer to the rich. He will save the righteous and destroy the wicked. Those who are citizens of his kingdom will be citizens of a peaceable kingdom. It will be a place of justice and fair treatment for all. It will be a place of salvation and deliverance. It will be a place of security.

Understand though, that security and safety are not the same things. Security is that quality that is a base for us to be courageous bearers of light and salvation to others. Our king, Jesus, was secure in his position. He was secure in who he was and certain in his teaching. He was not safe. It was not safe to be one of his disciples. The peaceable kingdom often runs into violent resistance – sometimes from the people we would least expect.

John the Baptizer, when he was preaching about the coming king, said that those who heard him should repent and bear fruits of repentance. Those who fail to turn toward justice, mercy, compassion, kindness, and honesty will be tossed out and judged based on how they treated others. Those who turn toward the forgiveness the king offers will be judged according to the righteousness of the king. His righteousness will cover our failings and give us the security to act in ways that challenge the world we live in.

And we welcome all who will come. We remember that we were once welcomed by Christ, so we welcome others. We serve the good King who gives life to all.
