Remember

(Romans 15:1-4; Hebrews 11:39-12:3)

This weekend is the time that we set aside as a nation to remember those who gave their lives serving our nation in armed conflict. It was initiated on May 30, 1868 after the Civil War and was changed to the last Monday in May in 1971. Since the draft ceased and it takes fewer people to fight in our wars, much of the nation now lives without very much awareness of our military. It is hard to remember what one never knows in the first place.

Many of us grew up in traditions that attempted to detach from history and from much of the Bible story. This can result in faith that may be strong, but it is not attached to story. This works on us in a couple of ways that are not helpful to us. First, it can make us not just critical of those who came before, but condescending or judgmental. Second, it can prevent us from changing when change may be called for if our history goes back only as far as our parents or grandparents. Changing is not a condemnation of previous generations, it is an extension of their faith.

Every generation is in danger of losing the story of God and his people. It has been happening since before there were kings in Israel. There were generations that grew up not knowing what God had done to rescue his people from Egypt. It takes some work to tell the story to the next generation and it takes some imagination to connect each generation with all those who have gone before.

The story was built into the calendar of festivals in the Old Testament, and the story of the church is built into the calendar of our religious holidays. This is the reason Easter and Christmas are so important. But there is much more than this. If one wants to understand the history of the Old Testament read the Psalms. The hymns of Israel rehearsed every important event in Israel's history. Hymns today play much the same role.

But knowing the story is also important for us to appreciate more deeply who Jesus is and what he has done for us. The apostle Paul connects the work of Christ with "what has been written before for our instruction." The writer of Hebrews tells Christians that all of those who have gone before longed to see the days that we are living in now. We read of the disciples remembering in the Gospels what the Scripture said concerning Jesus (John 2:17, 22), and what Jesus had told them as they stood astounded at the resurrection (Luke 24:1-8).

Learn the story, teach the story, remember the story.

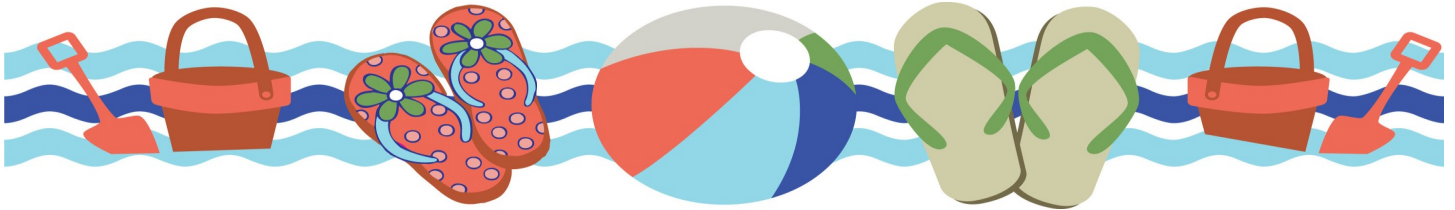

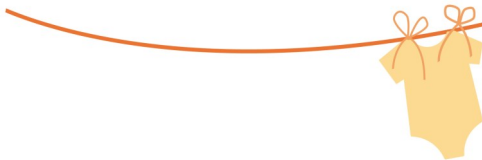

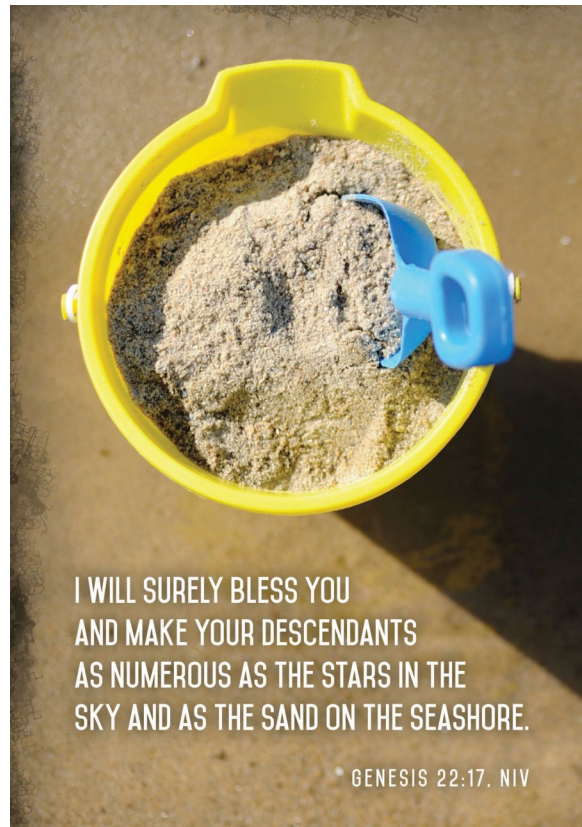
