Our Dwelling Place

(Psalm 90)

Psalm 90 turns the page in the hymnbook of God's people. It is the first psalm in book four of the psalter. Book three ends with some troubling questions. Israel has been unfaithful and now she wants to turn back to God . . . but where is he? What will he do with them. It is possible that this song was written during the Babylonian captivity.

Read on the heels of the previous two psalms, it makes sense. This is a people that is looking for refuge. They long for a "dwelling place." It is no wonder that they would write a poem and call it "Moses' Prayer." Recall that Israel turned to a golden calf as God was instructing Moses on the mountain. What was God to do with such a people. The story in Exodus 34 is a reminder that the outcome was in doubt – and even then, there was more trouble ahead.

Here we are reminded of that God is our dwelling place. It is not a temple. It is not a church building. It is not our houses, our community, or our nation. . . but God. This is a comfort and reminder that we have less control over their lives than we think. God is eternal and he sees the full sweep of history – we are "here today and gone tomorrow."

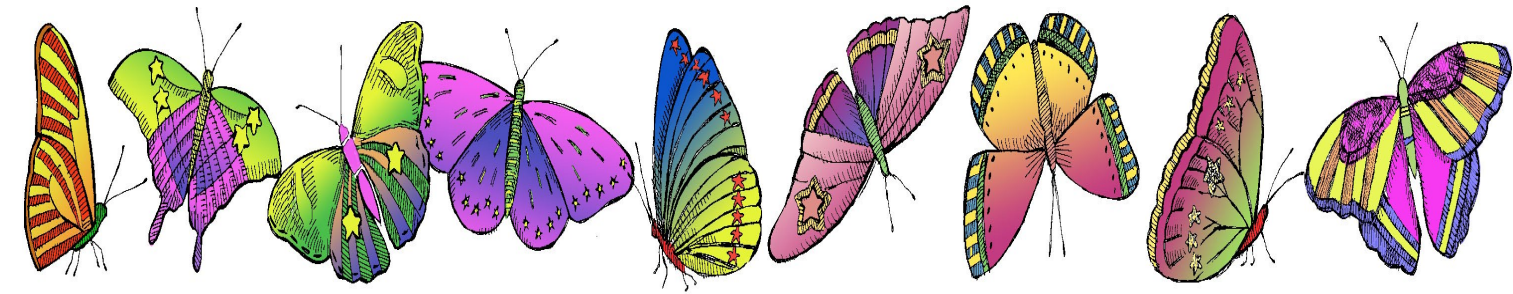
It makes sense that they would look back to the days of Moses as he led the people through the wilderness. Which is, incidentally, where book four concludes in Psalm 106 with a plea for God to gather them from among the nations (vs. 47). We have been talking this year about how God forms his people in every generation. We read in the gospel of Matthew that the church is to go into all nations, teaching and baptizing in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This is to accompany teaching.

All this fits very well into the story that we are told in book four of the Psalms. A plea for God to hear us and give us wisdom. The return of the messianic king. A recounting and teaching of the mighty deeds of God. Jesus teaches us in John 15:1-11 that we are to "abide in Christ." Paul tells us that we are a dwelling place for God.

Psalm 90 is a reminder that we are finite and God is infinite. It is a song that reminds us that we are to "work while it is yet daytime, because the night is coming when no one can work." Our work is governed by our faith in God. Our work is to first be committed to having a "heart of wisdom" (vs. 12).

The troubling questions asked in Psalm 89 are not yet resolved in Psalm 90. This is a Psalm that is in between – very much like the space that we inhabit as Christians today as we await the return of the king. Will he find faith on earth?
