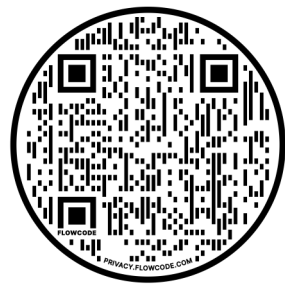

Church of Christ

June 14, 2026

In our Right Minds

(Philippians 2; Acts 16)

I wonder what happened to that slave girl that followed Paul around Philippi for days, harassing him with a true statement so much that he turned and cast the demon out of her. I wonder if there was a woman in the household of Lydia named Euodia. I wonder if the jailer’s wife was named Syntyche. There is no way to know but remembering how the church in Philippi was formed may help us to understand why Paul was so interested in them finding their joy again.

There are few things that can take the joy out of people being together than a dispute between two people that spills over into the gathering. I am not talking about the run of the mill disagreements we might have over how to get things done. I am talking about the kind of challenges a group can face when two or more people are not bringing the right attitude with them. This is how choosing paint color or landscaping can turn into real trouble. It is almost never the problem that is the problem but rather the fears of what the problem may press to the surface.

So we know that in Philippi there were Jews (likely Hellenized Jews) who met at a “place of prayer.” This is where congregations would meet if there were not enough men to form a synagogue. We know that there was a family of Romans whose breadwinner was a jailer. We know that there were two women who were having difficulty seeing eye-to-eye. About what? We don’t know – Paul just tells them that they need to “agree in the Lord.”

I truly wish that I knew exactly what Paul meant when he said that, but I think we can at least move in the right direction by looking at what he said before that instruction. Paul is in prison and it seems that there were some that were discouraged by that. Interesting, given events when he visited the city earlier.

This morning I want us to think about the mindset that Paul calls the Philippian church to have and what that might look like for us today. He tells them to be of the same mind. Then he tells them what he means by this. I have heard more than one sermon and few Bible classes suggest that being of the same mind means we all must agree on points of doctrine.

What is interesting here is that Paul, the Pharisee, does not give us legal doctrine to chew on or fuss over. Instead, he gives us teaching about Christ and his mindset. We are to imitate that. We are to look after our interests *and* the interests of others. To do that we must diminish ourselves enough to see things from their point of view. We are to have the mind of a servant – no matter our station in life. We are to humble ourselves and pronounce Jesus Christ is Lord. These are attitudes that not only display unity, but they unleash service to each other and to the world to share the good news we have in Christ. We don’t have to agree to be of the same mind. We have to “agree in the Lord”, as in, he is the one to whom we answer.
