Hold On... To Him

(Hebrews 10:19-23)

The words “hold on” can mean different things in the English language, or even prompt songs, movie quotes, or sayings to enter our mind based on the context we hear those words in. If we add the words “To Him” however, that gives us a much different picture. Even though we are believers, so often we rely upon our own selves to do so much in our lives. We attempt to take things on all alone at times, possibly not even considering that we have an all knowing and all-powerful God behind us. Why do we do this? I suppose it is human nature, but as Christians, we must have confidence in Our Creator, the One who has placed us where we stand for a specific reason. No matter the circumstance, we must hold on to Him!

We must hold on to Him when the storm is raging. We are no stranger to difficult times, challenges, or situations here. And when we are in the midst of those troubles, it truly feels like a storm is churning all around us. And if we know anything about storms, we know they bring darkness. But just because it may be dark does not mean the light is gone. In fact, the Light is always there, but we must hold on to Him, continue to trust His plan, and as difficult as it may be, continue to praise Him, hope, pray, and cling to the promise He gives us. (James 1:2-4)

We must hold on to Him when we don't understand. One of the toughest things can be not understanding something. One of the most difficult parts of faith is trusting God when His plans don't make sense to us. But think of Mary, Job, or Joseph. What was going through their minds? We know how those stories end. Faith is not knowing everything God is doing. Faith is holding on to Him even when we don't know what He is doing or why. (Proverbs 3:5)

We must hold on to Him because His promises are true. And His Word tells us to hold on. The hope we have is not based on something we can see or feel, but rather on the promise he gives us. Think of Abraham or David. Was he not faithful to them? And just as he was then, he will be faithful to the promise He gives us. (Hebrews 10:23)

We must hold on to Him because we can. God is not unreachable, unapproachable, or anything remotely close to those. He wants us to hold on to Him, be close to Him, and communicate with Him. He is present, active, and gives us a path to Him. He is the only one strong enough to take on and carry all of our burdens. (Isaiah 41:10)

We must hold on to Him because He is holding on to you. There are moments in our life where our connection with God feels weak. The good news is that our feeling matters less, and is more about how tightly God holds on to us. Regardless of our feeling, He is always there. Jesus tells us this just days before He gives himself up for all of us. So whenever we are feeling tired, weary, overwhelmed, etc., if we stay true to Him and continue to hold on to Him, He will always hold on to us. (John 10:27-30)

So hold on to Him. Hold on to His promise. Cling to the King of Kings who calls you His own. Hold fast to the One who sets you free. Do not waver from the One who defeated death and has broken every chain. Hold on to Jesus Christ, Our Living Hope.

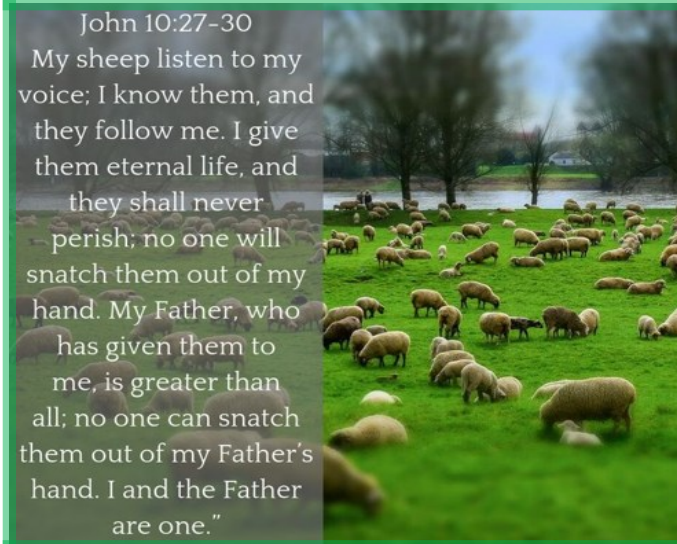

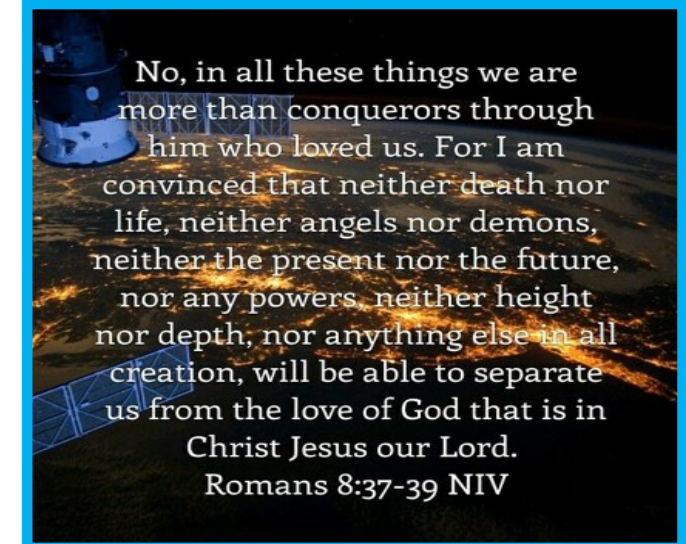
