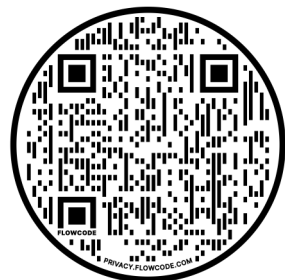

Judge, King, and Savior!

(Psalm 96, 97, 98)

Psalm 97 is one in a series of seven “enthronement” Psalms. Each one speaks in some way about God being king. If these were included in the enthronement of the kings of Israel and Judah, they make it clear that God is still the one who is the ruler. They also make it clear that when God is our king, we can be assured that the one on the throne is righteous and just and wants to save us.

The three Psalms we are looking at this morning follow the well-known Psalm 95, which we often sing. Psalm 95 is the one that the writer of Hebrews quotes so often as he is reminding his readers (listeners) that “today is the day of salvation.”

These are Psalms of great joy and praise, but they are also Psalms of gravity. These are reminders of the great love and power of a God/King who will judge the earth according to his will – not ours.

Psalm 96 looks forward to the time when God will judge. This is a Psalm that reminds us to “tell the nations”, that the Lord is king. One might go so far as to say that it is a song of evangelism. There is good news here. The God before whom all will fall down and worship is also a God that will judge the world in righteousness. There is no king, ruler, or judge that is capable of such. If I am to be judged, let it be by the God who is just and righteous and wants me to draw near to him.

We have been told that the king is coming and we had better be ready. Psalm 97 reminds us that God is not only judge (Psalm 96), he is also creator. This is one of those places where God is described as dwelling in “Clouds and thick darkness.” This represents the impenetrable nature of God’s power and wisdom. This calls to mind Mt. Sinai – from which the law came. It reminds us of the chaos that existed before creation and the chaos of “uncreation” that will occur when God judges those who are unrighteous.

The righteous have nothing to fear and look forward to the creator judging his creation. “Light is sown upon the righteous, and joy to the upright in heart. Rejoice in the Lord, righteous ones, and praise to his holy name.” (Ps. 97:11-12).

Psalm 98 encourages us to sing! To sing a new song! To sing about God’s salvation of his people in the sight of the nations. To sing because God has remembered his steadfast love and his faithfulness to his people.

We, as believers in Christ, can sing this song as well. When the world looks at the church, does it see the salvation of God? What witness are we to the nations? Let’s remember who God is and what he has done for us!

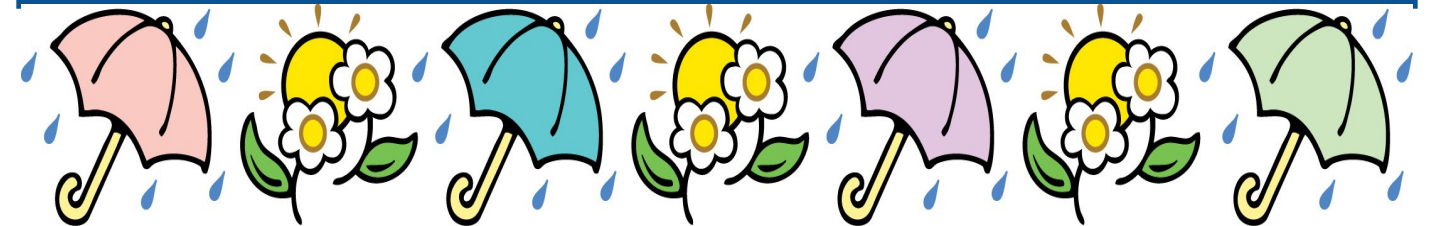
