

# **Assurance and Joy**

(Isaiah 54:1-55:13)

Joy is not a thing that can be chased. It is, as C.S. Lewis indicates, something that happens to us that acts as a marker that we are on the right path. There is another way that I think of joy. It is something that we can possess as a gift from God. It is still something that can't be chased. It still acts as an emotion that happens as we are living life. It is also something that can live in us. Perhaps this is what makes it possible for us to recognize it when it happens.

For years, I struggled with those who possessed joy to such a degree that it leeched out of them even in difficult times. There have been a few times when I thought that they were pretending, either for my sake or as evidence of denial of the dire situation they were in. The hymn, *Blessed Assurance*, expresses well the connection between assurance and joy.

Isaiah 54 and 55 are the final two chapters in this section of the book. While they are separate oracles, they touch upon the themes of assurance and joy. What if we were assured that everything important in our lives would be a success? What if we knew from the beginning that those projects that we began would be done well? As believers in God through Christ we have that assurance. It is assurance that is not based on human faithfulness, but the faithfulness of God who created us and loves us and wants salvation for us.

This does not exclude difficulty along the way. There is something within us that longs for and appreciates the struggle to overcome obstacles. This is why, when we are doing the right thing and it is hard we don't quit. We work for that goal that will be worth all the effort.

Isaiah 54 tells us that we have a faithful God that he will restore his people. He reminds us that his steadfast love and compassion is eternal. He reminds us that no matter what happens, God's steadfast love will not leave them and his, "covenant of peace shall not be removed." These are words of assurance that we can depend upon. These are not vain and idle promises that are made by well-meaning people who do not have the power to guarantee what is promised.

It is this assurance that makes it possible for us to possess joy that those who do not seek the Lord can't understand. God, in chapter 55, tells us that his salvation to us is free for anyone who will seek him. The encouragement is for us to seek the Lord while we have the opportunity. This, it seems, should be our focus and our goal. If we seek the Lord and we possess the joy that it brings, we will have opportunities to share the faith that we have in God through Jesus.

It can be tempting to focus on the sin of others and tell them that they need to seek God. Perhaps we would be better off seeking God and focusing on forgiveness and transformation. As we are doing that, we can help others do the same.
