What's the Story? (Ephesians 1:1-14)

Every book of the Bible was written for a reason that existed long before we ever arrived in this world. Most of the questions asked and answered are still relevant to us today. That is why it is important for us to try to figure out why a book was written before we spend too much time figuring out what it means.

Most of the New Testament books give us some indication of what the problems were. This is especially true of Paul's letters. There is, however, one exception: Ephesians. There doesn't seem to be any immediate problem being addressed. So, what is going on here.

We can think of Ephesians as being preventative medicine. It is a reminder of the unity that believers have in Christ. It sets for us the story in which we are to live as believers. It reminds us of the wonderful grace that has been extended to us by God through Christ and how the Holy Spirit works in us. It gives us some guidelines as to how we are to live in that grace that God has given to us.

After the opening greeting, verses 3-14 are one long sentence in Greek. The repetition drives home the gifts of grace we have received. In that culture such an extensive description of gifts would have evoked in the hearers an obligation to respond by seeing to it that the benefactor's will be done. This is not transactional talk. It is relational talk.

A transactional understanding of grace means that a gift has been transferred to me based on my belief. Since I believe, I receive grace. Everything is finished and I must do all I can to pay God back for what he has done for me, which I can never do. A relational understanding implies a continuing relationship. Because I have received gifts from God, I return gifts to him. This relationship is based on the benefactor giving gifts and the recipient seeing that the benefactor's will is done does not end. This is more in line with a biblical understanding of grace.

Psalm 116:12-19 says, "What shall I render to the Lord for all his bounty to me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord, I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of his people . . . You have loosed my bonds. I will offer to thee the sacrifice of thanksgiving and call on the name of the Lord."

This helps us with better understanding why it is that those who abide in Christ (relationship) also bear fruit (John 15:1-11). It helps us to understand that the spiritual sacrifice and the transforming of our minds Paul speaks of in Romans is about a relationship with God (Romans 12:1-2). Living in God's grace means living in the story that God has planned for the world. This story is what interprets all the others. This story is what determines our relationship to other narratives and how we respond to them. By grace we have been saved – and so we should live like it.
