HOMILY

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

INTRODUCTION: Presider

The Narrator will read the following, as all silently ponder the questions

Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

Do I go to Mass every Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation?

Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body?

Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

Do I show my parents due respect?

Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible?

Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind?

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?

Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

CELEBRATION OF RECONCILIATION

Presider: Together, let us acknowledge that we

have not always lived the way God

intended for us:

All: My God,

I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and in failing to do good,

I have sinned against you, whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help,

to do penance, to sin no more,

and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.

Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us.

In his name, my God, have mercy.

Amen.

Thank you all for coming today—we are glad you are here! Here are some notes to assist during individual confession time:



If you would prefer to remain anonymous and confess behind a screen, you may go to our pastor Fr. Michaeal McClane located in the Reconciliation Chapel in the Atrium.

When you have finished celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation, you are free to leave.

And lastly, please offer one another the gift of SILENCE during confession.
