Reconciliation Ministry advances the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)'s journey toward wholeness by empowering each expression of the Church to implement structural change to address historic fractures caused by racism and the systems that perpetuate it. It is the goal of our shared work to foster life-giving community within our church and in relationship with the whole family of God. We accomplish this mission through intentional dialogue, inclusive worship and experiential education.

SENIOR MINISTER SEARCH UPDATE

The Senior Minister search committee had a productive summer. Below is a brief update of our work as well as some background information.

Before concluding his term as Interim Regional Minister, Rev. Randy Kuss worked with our committee and on our behalf to seek out potential candidates. This included persons actively searching for a new ministry position and some not actively searching that we asked him to contact on our behalf. Rev. Michael Davison, our new Regional Minister, has picked up this work and continues to work on our behalf within the boundaries of the search and call process.

This summer, we have received and reviewed ministerial profiles of candidates and so far have held a first round of interviews with three candidates. As interviews began in August, Rev. Davison reminded the committee about confidentiality. "The process, how we are serving the congregation, is open, but the candidates and conversations with candidates are confidential." He has also reminded us that our denomination is a small family. Our confidentiality protects potential candidates, their congregations, and our own here at First Christian Church.

We are encouraged and appreciate your patience and prayers to sustain us as we continue on this journey on behalf of the congregation. If you have questions, please contact me and I will share what I can within the boundaries of our covenant of confidentiality.
