Genesis 37:18 “But they saw him in the distance, and before he reached them, they plotted to *kill* him.”

Deuteronomy 19:11 “But if out of *hate* someone lies in wait, assaults and *kills* a neighbor...”

Joshua 20:5 KJV “Then if the avenger of blood pursues him, they shall not deliver the slayer into his hand, because he struck his neighbor unintentionally, but did not *hate* him beforehand.”
