Growing in the Knowledge of the Lord

This past year has been another season of continued growth in the knowledge of our Lord, Jesus Christ. We take this command seriously and literally as it is prescribed to us by the Bible. We have sensed that the Lord is trying to bring us toward another level of spiritual maturity by increasing our faith and developing our discernment. Weekly Devotionals

International Fellowship of Canada Ministries: School of Theology

We began our theology classes with approximately 10-12 members of our church, and we have now seen it grow closer to 30 people. With each new course, we see new members join in. When asked to share why they considered joining the class, many of them stated they wanted to grow in the knowledge of their Bibles. We are incredibly enthusiastic about the way the Lord is using these classes to spark a holy desire in our people for sound doctrine. We pray that many more would be impacted and used for the glory of Jesus Christ.



Children's Ministry

The mission of our Children's Ministry is to partner with families to disciple and evangelize the next generation.

We believe wholeheartedly that parents are the primary disciplers of their children, and everything we do—from Sunday school lessons to Bible studies and camps—is designed to equip and support you in that sacred calling. Our prayer is that every parent would not only teach their children about God but also model Christlike love and grace at home and beyond, leading by example just as Christ leads us.

We stand in awe of God's faithfulness as our church family continues to grow. This year, we've seen a significant increase in regular Sunday attendance, reminding us of the deep need for intentional discipleship in every age group. We continued our journey through the Bible, helping children understand that Scripture is not a collection of separate stories but one unified story—the story of our Rescuer, Jesus Christ—and that they are part of His redemptive plan.



This ministry would not be possible without our incredible volunteer team. Over 30 dedicated men, women, youth, and middle school kids serve in rotation, pouring out their time, energy, and love. Every volunteer completed our annual "Plan to Protect" training to ensure a safe, nurturing, and biblically grounded environment for all children. We remain deeply thankful for their servant hearts and faithful leadership.



For our older students, the Junior High Bible Study has become a powerful space for spiritual growth and transformation. We have seen an increased hunger for God's Word and presence in their lives. Alongside receiving relevant, biblically sound teaching, they are encouraged to use their God-given gifts by serving in our Kids Church—planting seeds of leadership and a servant's heart in the next generation.

This year, we currently have 8 junior high students regularly attending. Together, we studied the books of Daniel and Revelation, and in the coming season, we will be focusing on the foundational teachings of Christ (Hebrews 6) and then diving into the Gospels. A heartfelt thank you to Bobby Alexander for co-teaching and investing in these young lives.

TRAIL TREKKERS

This past summer, we held our second annual IFC Kids Vacation Bible School (VBS)—and it was a tremendous success! With 53 children participating, "Trail Trekkers: Trust, Submit, and Journey On" took kids on a faith-filled adventure through God's Word using interactive lessons, worship, skits, games, and crafts. Each day focused on a camping-themed tool and connected it to a spiritual truth, teaching children about God's love, guidance, provision, and protection. They learned to trust Him completely in their personal lives and were challenged to be light and salt in the world around them.

Our 20 passionate volunteers were the heartbeat of this ministry—loving, praying for, and encouraging every child. They met each child right where they were: from the shy ones who found confidence during crafts to the energetic ones who led worship marches, and the curious ones asking deep faith questions. Many leaders shared how God reignited their own faith through serving, with one saying, "I came to serve, but God refilled my heart." To our extraordinary team: thank you for being the hands and feet of Jesus.

Men's Ministry

The Men's Ministry of IFC Church has purposed to study the Word in order to show ourselves approved by God.

As devoted men of God, our aim is to remain committed to His will for ourselves and our families. Over the past year, we have diligently explored various scripture topics, including the books of 1st and 2nd Timothy, the Sermon On the Mount, Malachi, Proverbs, and 1 Thessalonians. On average, our weekly Bible study attendance has remained steady at 12-16 participants. We have noted that many of our men are encouraging other brothers to join the Tuesday night studies, which is a great blessing.

To stay connected in fellowship, we hosted another men's breakfast at a local restaurant. There, we gathered together to invest in one another and deepen our relationships. We hope to continue to do more events like this in the future.



Women's Ministry

Our Women's Ministry has sought to build a community of women whose lives are built on loving God wholeheartedly and loving others as we love ourselves.

This past year, we continued the strong emphasis on spiritual growth that has been a hallmark of our ministry. We emphasized deepening our walk in the Word, encouraging fellowship, and creating spaces for women to be empowered spiritually. We saw exponential growth in our Bible study sessions, with 17-20 women attending sessions each week. We explored books named and centered around life-changing women in the Bible and introduced a couple of thematic studies focused on topics relevant to the lives of women in general.



We saw wonderful engagement from last fiscal year's health and wellness sessions, and we built on that success by inviting ladies from among us to host various topics, which included health and wellness promotion through natural remedies, employment strategies, exploring the French language, and discussions about marriage and faith. Through these topics, we created space for open conversations so that our women felt supported in various areas of life.



We will continue to offer more practical sessions, particularly on topics related to young Christian women within our Church body.

Some highlights and key events for last year included our Women's Breakfast which took place in October 2023. Our theme was "Persevering Through Hard Times" based on Romans 5:3-4. We heard reports of renewed strength and hope. Individuals felt equipped to face their own challenges knowing that they are not alone and that perseverance is a shared spiritual journey with God always by our side. Our 1-Day Women's Conference was held in May 2024, and the key theme was "For Such a Time As This," based on Esther 4:14. This was an awesome time of worship, teaching, and fellowship. We were proud to launch our new project—Charis Care, which provides feminine and health products to women in need. We have started this work within our local community with hopes to expand globally. We closed our Bible studies year with a potluck filled with fun, food, and fellowship.

Our leadership team is committed to ensuring that women in our church know they are supported, seen, and valued. By strengthening communication via announcements, social media, and pulpit reminders, we are creating intentional pathways for every woman to be included. We remain prayerful that every step taken in this ministry will honor the Lord and bear fruit that will pass on from generation to generation. As we continue forward, our desire is to see women rooted deeply in Scripture, strengthened in fellowship, and equipped to serve their families, church, and community.

Lastly, on the last Wednesday of each month, our pastors and a worship team member continue to hold a small church service, bringing joy not only to the residents but also to the nursing home staff.

To foster connection between children, parents, and grandparents, we continue to collaborate with the Children's and Prayer Ministries by hosting our "Love in Action" event. This annual event brings families together to wrap Christmas gifts for our nursing home seniors.

We give glory and honor to our faithful and loving God, who answers the cries and prayers of His children in His perfect time and way. Recently, my sister-in-law, Loida, experienced severe chest pain and difficulty breathing while walking home. She took her medication, but the pain worsened. Unable to get immediate help from family, she courageously took an Uber to the emergency room. Soon after, we learned she had a serious heart blockage and needed quadruple bypass surgery. I immediately reached out to Pastor Zia and Sister Christine, and together we began to cover her in prayer, along with our family and church community. After further testing, the doctors confirmed the surgery and scheduled it. On Monday at 11:30 AM, the procedure began and lasted four hours. By Wednesday, when we visited her, Loida was already awake, talking, and recovering well. What's more—what was originally supposed to be a quadruple bypass turned out to be only a triple bypass. Praise God! To our amazement, by Friday—just five days after surgery—Loida was discharged and sent home. Her healing and recovery have been nothing short of miraculous. We stand in awe of God's power, mercy, and divine timing. Truly, He is our Healer, our ever-present Help, and the One who holds all things together.

We have around 12 kids who attend our church but are not regularly part of our family. From what we could gather, they did not know Jesus Christ. One of the parents who reached out to me came as an invitation from a young boy whom we invited. She's Catholic, and she saw the joy in her child after attending. She opened up that she's going through a divorce and that this has been a very difficult season for her and her family. We ended up connecting, and I am praying she decides to come to our church and find a community that will walk with her. However, at RISE Youth, we view this time period as the perfect breeding ground for forming the Christian giants of the future!

Over the past year at RISE Youth, we've witnessed firsthand the transformative power of Christ in the lives of young people. Particular effort was made this year to develop and strengthen relational bonds between leaders, leaders and youth parents, as well as leaders and students, to create a vibrant and healthy biblical community for students to rely on, providing each student with the confidence to know they are loved and not alone in this journey of faith.



Many new systems and strategies were implemented to make this goal of connection a reality, including informative and collaborative triannual meetings with youth parents, triannual leadership meetings/trainings to equip leaders with the necessary skills to effectively mentor.

and care for youth, and most prominent of all, our new discipleship initiative, assigning each youth leader the responsibility of spiritual specific formation in youth through individualized care and mentorship. The fruit of this goal of relationship building has been highly beneficial and a core strength of the group presently, as youth relationships strengthened dramatically, allowing leaders greater opportunities to speak biblical truths into the lives of teens.



One piece of evidence of this was our end-of-school-year summer BBQ, to which teens were very receptive to the testimonial advice from members of our leadership team. In an effort to continue strengthening relational bonds, we've increased the frequency and length of our youth program to three-hour bi-weekly meetings starting in September 2025.

Moving forward, in addition to continuing our goal of growing relationships within the program, our emphasis for the 2025-2026 school year will be on biblical literacy, helping teens learn how to understand their Bibles, what they believe, and why they believe it. Please pray that the Lord will instill a passion in the lives of the youth to know God's will, as well as for the appropriate accompanying leaders to guide them on this journey.

IFC Missions

DAWN R. | MISSION'S INTERCESSORY LEADER



IFC Church has aimed to increase awareness for global mission efforts by providing for both the physical and spiritual needs of God's people. Our chief desire is to carry the Good News of the Gospel to the ends of the earth so that many will know the name of Jesus and continue building the global church.

The IFC Missions Committee convened in February of this year. During the first meeting, the IFC Missions Manual was presented to the team and was approved after several small changes were made. The manual was created to provide general guidelines for the Church and the Missions leadership team as they seek to fulfill the Great Commission of our Lord.

During the meetings that were convened, discussions were held on the proposed mission projects for 2025. The projects under consideration were (1) to assist with the extension of the Sanctuary at the Church in India and (2) to assist in building a hospital in the vicinity of the previously mentioned church.

After much consideration, the hospital project in India was selected as the project to be funded for 2025. However, due to the high cost of travel to India, it was decided that this would not be a "boots-on-the-ground" project, but rather strictly financial aid, with the option of two members going to deliver the funds and have an overview of the project.

Several activities were suggested to raise funds towards the project. The proposed activities included garage sales, BBQs, takeout lunches, sales of t-shirts and snacks at the church's summer events. The Committee organized a successful BBQ and garage sale over the summer which netted over \$3,000.00. A second garage sale scheduled for August was canceled due to the church's renovation plans.

Currently, the India Mission project is on hold while Pastor Zia examines the transfer of funds. Going forward, the Mission Committee will be exploring mission opportunities that align with IFC's vision of missions within Brampton's local community and Canada as a whole. We continue to pray for the right people who are passionate and committed to the call of the Lord; for guidance as to where and to whom to direct our missionary efforts; for divine appointment of the right people in the right positions and the financial resources to fund the approved projects.
