Jesus, help me serve others humbly and lovingly, following your example.



-Rebuilding in western KY is going to take years, so a volunteer group that's raring to go can be connected to the volunteer coordinators in Calvert City or Madisonville and jump right in. I would expect that eastern KY can also receive volunteers to help with rebuilding after the floods last summer and those contacts would be helpful.

The tornadoes in MS were so recent that there's no ability to field and organize volunteers yet. It's still first responders. A National Response

Team from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is deploying to begin assessing needs and forming partnerships for ongoing support there.
