

Georgia District Children's Ministries **Junior Camp Guidelines and Dress Code**



General Guidelines

1. Campers must show respect for authority and a proper attitude at all times.
2. All registered campers must be under the supervision of camp personnel.
3. There is to be no physical contact with the opposite sex.
4. Registered campers may not bring any radios, personal listening devices, or two-way radios to camp.
5. Campers must attend ALL scheduled services and sessions unless excused by supervisory staff.
6. Junior Camp has a closed campus policy. All campers must register upon entering the campgrounds. Only registered campers are allowed to be on the grounds during the day or to reside in the dorms.
7. Outside visitors to Junior Camp are limited to the evening services only. Other visitors will be allowed only at the discretion of the Camp Director.
8. No camper will be allowed to stay in or use a private camper or mobile home without the Camp Director's prior approval of both the arrangement and the adult supervision who must reside in the private home with the camper at all times.
9. Junior Camp is officially over at the close of the Friday day session which ends at approximately 12:00 p.m. All pastors or parents should check with camp supervision to determine the exact time of camp dismissal. All campers must be picked up at that time by previously authorized adults.
10. *Parents of each camper must identify, on the Georgia District UPCI Sunday School Department Event Registration Form, Request to Participate, Hold Harmless and Release Agreement, the person authorized to pick up their child from camp. Any change in the authorization must be made by verbal contact of the Pastor or Parent to the Camp Director.*
11. Campers may be sent home for failure to comply with rules.

Young Ladies' Dress Code

1. Slacks, pants, culottes, or any other garment that divides the legs may not be worn as an outer garment.
2. Hemlines of skirts or dresses must be below the knees both standing and sitting down.
3. Splits must end 1 inch below the knee. Wrap around skirts should follow this same principle.
4. All skirts and/or dresses must be modest in fit.
5. All blouses and dresses must have a modest neckline. All buttons are to be buttoned with the exception of the collar button.
6. All blouses and shirts must be of sufficient length so as not to expose the midsection at any time.
7. Modest sleeve lengths are to be worn which do not expose the underarm area at any time.
8. No sheer (see-through) fabric is acceptable as outer clothing. Sheer material should not come above the knees or elbows.
9. Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times outside the dorm.

Young Men's Dress Code

1. Shirts are to have a modest neckline and all buttons are to be buttoned with the exception of the collar button.
2. All clothing must be modest in fit. No tight-fitting pants or shirts.
3. All shirts are to be of sufficient length so as not to expose the midsection.
4. Modest sleeve lengths are to be worn which do not expose the underarm area at any time.
5. No long hair (over the ears or shirt collar).
6. Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times outside the dorm.
7. No shorts are to be worn outside the dorms.

General Dress Code

1. No outer garment or caps are to be worn that have lettering and/or symbols that represent, advertise, or promote Hollywood-promoted persons or films. This also includes secular musical identification.
2. No make-up of any type including foundation liquid, powder, blush, lipstick, or colored lip gloss.
3. No jewelry of any kind.
4. An executive committee consisting of the Camp Director, Principal, District Superintendent, and District Secretary must approve the necessity of enforcement of any dress code or other rule that may arise and is not covered by these prescribed rules. This rule, once determined, will then remain in force until changed by a District Conference Amendment to the prescribed rules.
