During my time at Navy officer training, I heard the story of Horace Greasley. In case you’re not familiar with the name, Greasley was a British soldier during World War II, and he was captured by the German Wehrmacht and imprisoned in May of 1940. In telling the story of his captivity and suffering under the German SS, Greasley recalls that his vitality and endurance were sustained in large part by a clandestine love affair he enjoyed with a woman outside of the POW camp named Rosa Rauchbach. Greasley was so enamored with Rosa that, during his imprisonment, he escaped and snuck back into his POW camp over 200 times just so he could see his lover face to face. Even at the risk of torture and death, it was love – rather than fear – that motivated the young soldier to defy his enemy and pursue the object of his affection.

As the New Year begins, what or who is the object of your affection? We are called in Scripture to love the Lord our God with all our heart, all our mind, and all our strength. In Revelation 2, the Lord challenges the church in Ephesus to turn back to Him, their first love. The call and the challenge are there for us, too. Horace Greasley left no room for Rosa Rauchbach to doubt his love for her. Have you left room in your relationship with the Lord that He might doubt the sincerity of your love for Him? Or, are you pursuing Him in total defiance of every barrier and hindrance the Enemy tries to put in your path?

If Christ truly is our first love, we ought to follow the Apostle Paul’s instructions by throwing off “everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles,” so that we can live the life of love God set us free to live. Nothing in all Creation can separate us from the love He has for us in Christ.

I believe 2016 will be a great year for East Woods. I look forward to sharing the journey with you, and I pray God’s presence and blessings will surround you in rich abundance.

A NOTE FROM FINANCE ELDER TOM KOECHER:

In late January 2016, the East Woods Presbyterian Church membership will be asked to approve a proposed 2016 budget that has been reviewed and approved by Session. I like to think of the budget as my stewardship responsibility, it is a financial plan that has been entrusted to me, the Finance Commission which I chair and your Session.

A great deal of time and energy goes into the budget development. As your Session, we are dealing largely with estimates. Nothing new here, except with your **HELP**, we could have more “*faith*” in our estimates. “**HELP**” you ask? Yup, it’s not too late for you to **HELP**. We need your annual pledge information “**yesterday**”. EWPC is currently looking at the lowest response to the annual Stewardship/Commitment request in many years. Less than half the proposed 2016 spending plan is covered by the current pledges. Only 45 pledges have been received to date, a disappointing level.

Please, if you have not yet returned your 2016 Pledge, do so as soon as possible. “*God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed*”(2 Corinthians 9:8 NASB).

I look forward to discussing the exciting financial plans for EWPC when we meet in late January, 2016.

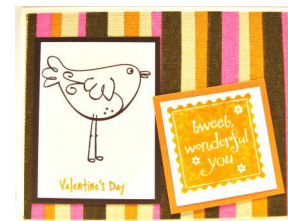
The Youth Group will kick off the New Year with their first regular meeting on Wednesday January 6th, 2016 from 6:30-8PM.
