



Chill in the morning, pumpkins, Halloween candy, strange creatures roaming door to door, end of Daylight Savings time, and it's that time of year for?.....Our Annual Congregational Meeting! Please join us November 12th at 12:15 in the GS Sanctuary to celebrate accomplishments in the past year, and explore and share opportunities to deepen your faith experience in 2018. An Informational Forum to address specific questions or concerns you may have will be November 5th at 10:00 in the Fireside Room.

Bringing God's hope, help, and healing to our changing world. Over this past year we have asked for your engagement and participation, and you responded. Using your input, Leadership and laity members have prayerfully discerned a Vision Frame that includes our Values, Measures, Map (Receive -Respond- Redirect), Mission Statement and Vision. Strategic planning teams are continuing sessions to identify specific areas to be addressed to make this Vision become a reality.



A significant component of this Vision Frame recognizes that you do not give your time, talents and resources to the church, rather your gifts are given through the church to accomplish God's mission through action. A new format, the Mission Spending Plan, has been developed to present our financial plan to the Congregation. We expect this narrative style budget will help to more clearly communicate our financial priorities to accomplish our vision, values and ministries.

The basis for this narrative budget is the traditional line item budget, developed for planning, review and accounting purposes. The Budget Committee, Trustees and Council have reviewed in detail and approved this document. Bottom line, the 2018 Budget is comparative to last year's allocation but has been increased 1.2% to a total of \$1,000,000.

Please take a moment to review our Vision Frame, and reflect and pray that God will show what significance it has for you. As

we vote to go forward in the next year consider how our Mission Spending Plan, nominees and incumbent leadership members align with the goals and aspirations contained within that frame. Most importantly focus on the center of our frame, our true vision: *Igniting passion for a life in Jesus*.

Communion Prep Class //





Library Book Review //

Instead of choosing one book on which to review, I am choosing to list some of the new books that have been acquired for the library. Because of Pastor Todd's emphasis on Martin Luther during this 500th Anniversary year of The Reformation, the library has added a number of books on Martin Luther.

The newest addition is <u>Martin Luther: The Man Who Rediscovered God And Changed The World</u> by Eric Metaxas. A partial quote from fellow author Mark Helpin: "A marvelous, brilliant book that is equal parts biography, theology, political philosophy, and cultural history."

We have two pamphlet type books called: <u>Martin Luther's Ninety-Five Theses</u>, that list all of the theses along with explanatory notes to aid understanding.

Two others: Martin Luther: Renegade and Prophet by Lyndal Roper and Martin Luther by Martin Marty.

These new books along with many others in our library, including the sermons of Martin Luther, will give the readers in our congregations choices to increase our understanding of The Reformation.

Another feature for the **little readers** in our midst are ten new "I Can Read" books, each on a Bible story. Come in and enjoy browsing the shelves for inspirational Christian reading.


Our number of households served during the past few months has steadily increased from just over 200 households in May to over 230 in September. We are blessed with adequate food to meet the needs and we have increased our giving to 5 days of food. Therefore, each household gets 15 meals per person to help with food insecurity. Our hearts are filled with gratitude.

We are planning to hand out about 300 Thanksgiving baskets. We have enough cranberry sauce and green beans already. We are in need of stove top dressing, turkey gravy, and cream of mushroom soup. We will accept fresh food of potatoes and yams as well as whole chickens or turkeys on Sunday, November 19 at the closet. We are distributing the food Monday and Tuesday mornings, November 20 and 21.

For our regular distribution the **urgent need is for boxed cereal, chili, ramen, and pork and beans.** We can always use oatmeal packets, fruit cups and hot chocolate packets for children's bags too.

For those of you that don't know, we offer household items and hygiene products as well as clothes at our Thanksgiving basket give away. Thank you to all who have donated to this project. It has been very well received. Pots and pans, dishes, bath towels, and linens are like pure gold to our neighbors.

45LIFE FAQ

Is my information secure?

The information contained in GSLife will not show up in any search engine and can only be viewed by members with a login and password.

Who can use GSLife?

Church members are the only people who can view the online directory. Attenders may be granted GSLife logins, but with absolutely no access to people information.

What can others see about me?

Church members can see your name, contact phone, email address and gender until you update your personal privacy settings. Your picture will also be visible if one is uploaded. You will only be identified with a group or class you participate in if you are the leader of that group.

Why should I add personal information?

There is a difference between what you *put in* GSLife and what you *choose to share*. What you put into GSLife is important for our church records, but you may choose to display as much or little of your personal information to other members in GSLife as you prefer.

Is information about children protected?

Children under the age of 14 are only visible in GSLife to their parents and appropriate church leaders and staff.

Who can see my giving?

Only you and appropriate church leaders and staff can view your personal and family giving records, or download your giving statement.

What if I don't have internet access?

Inside News is available weekly inside your worship program. Our monthly publication, *Good Shepherd News*, is available in the Welcome Center. Contact the church office to receive a printed member directory.
