Children in Worship

At the time of a child's baptism, the family and gathered community promise to bring children to worship. Being with family is how we learn to be family. Worship is no different. PRELUDE

Joseph Jongen (1873-1953) was a Belgian organist, composer, and music educator. He was a composition professor at the Liege Conservatory, and then director of the Royal Conservatory of Brussels. He composed symphonies, concertos, chamber music, and songs, but he is best remembered today for his organ works. His Symphonie Concertante is one of the greatest works for organ and orchestra.

This hymn was the winner of the hymn competition celebrating Fairmount's centennial last fall. The composer, Jayne Southwick Cool (b.1947), is the retired Director of Music at Bethel Lutheran Church in Middleburg Heights. A graduate of Baldwin-Wallace Conservatory, she writes music for brass, woodwinds, handbells, organ, and choirs.

ANTHEM

O How Amiable" was originally written for the Abinger Pageant of 1934. The son of an Anglican priest, Vaughan Williams considered himself an agnostic, but he wrote some of the most beautiful choral works for the church. He was strongly influenced by Tudor music and English folksong, which was a decisive break from Germaninfluenced music of the 19th

ır in almost all English-language hymnals (though not always together). The transforming power of love motivates the unending praise of the life to come, and this fine Welsh tune (whose name means "delightful") gives us a foretaste of endless song.

POSTLUDE

Karg-Elert (1877-1933) was a German composer of considerable fame in the early 19th century, best known for his works for organ and harmonium. His works were French-Influenced, and Germany of the 1920s and 1930s was not accepting of this music. His music was late-Romantic, with impressionistic tendencies. It has enjoyed a revival in recent years. The chorale tune "Nun Danket" is rather difficult to hear in this big work.
