The Lord has really risen! Luke 24:34



After Jesus died, he was placed in the tomb of one of his followers, Joseph, a rich man. Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean cloth. Joseph placed it in the tomb. The tomb was like a cave which had been carved out of the rocky side of a hill. Then, a great big stone was rolled to close the entrance. Joseph sadly left.






discussion questions

what you do


Before class, on card stock, photocopy this page, making one for each child. Cut out baton patterns.

what children do

- 1. Trace the word RISEN and color the baton.
- 2. Fold the baton on the dashed lines and tape the edges.
- 3. As music plays, follow the leader around the room, waving batons and singing. At the end of each song, shout, "Thank you, God! Jesus has risen!"

what you need



- Brown paper
- Construction paper
- · Ruler

- Hole punch
- Crayons or markers
- Paper fasteners, one for each child




finished picture

what you do

Before class, photocopy this page, making one for each child. Cut out picture. From brown paper, cut $3\frac{1}{2}$ -inch circles, making one for each child. Cut construction paper in half, making one 6x9-inch piece for each child. Punch holes as indicated on pictures, and punch a hole near the edge of each brown-paper circle.

what children do

- 1. Color pictures.
- 2. Attach a brown-paper circle to the picture with a paper fastener.
- 3. Glue moving stone picture to a piece of construction paper.

Wordless Easter Story

Use the cross pattern to cut a cross from metallic gold gift wrap and another cross from white construction paper. Glue the crosses on a sheet of blue paper. Cut out "The Easter Story" box and glue it on the page. Glue small artificial flowers on the ground around each cross.

Tell the wordless story several times.

- The blue background reminds us that Jesus came to Earth as a baby boy.
- The gold cross tells us that Jesus is God's own Son.
- The shape of the cross reminds us that Jesus died so that God can forgive any wrong things that we do.
- The white cross shows us how beautiful we look to God when we ask Jesus to forgive us, cleanse us from our sins, and be our Savior.

Discuss with your family how much God loves each one of them. Say a prayer of thanks together.
