“WHERE IS CHRIST?”

If Jesus' resurrection means that He is alive forevermore, then where is Christ? Obviously, the answer does not involve any search for His physical being. It is not as though someone might sometime discover Jesus living in or hiding in some remote place in the world. As Christians we might correctly say that, “He is seated at God’s right hand in heaven.” That is true, but Christ is in heaven as well as on earth. He said to His first disciples, “Lo I am with you always . . .” But where is He?

Maybe you remember what Jesus said in Matthew 18:20 “For where two or three are gathered together in My name, there I am in the midst of them.” This verse gives a real clue to “Where is Christ?” It localizes it, so to speak. It suggests where we can look for Christ. To find Christ is to find people—even a small number of people—who are gathered in His name. But where will you find such people gathered in His name? I would suggest that such people are not hard to find. They are people like you who love Jesus, whose hearts burn with hope concerning Him, and are never able to keep their identity a secret. You know who they are because they worship Christ, serve Him, obey Him, and await Him. When you have met up with a Christian, you have also met Christ. Remember the Bible passage that I asked you to remember at the beginning of January? “I live, yet not I, but Christ lives in me.”

The early Christians were driven with the certainty of seeing Christ again face to face. Christ lives, and with our eyes we will see Him. If we really believe this

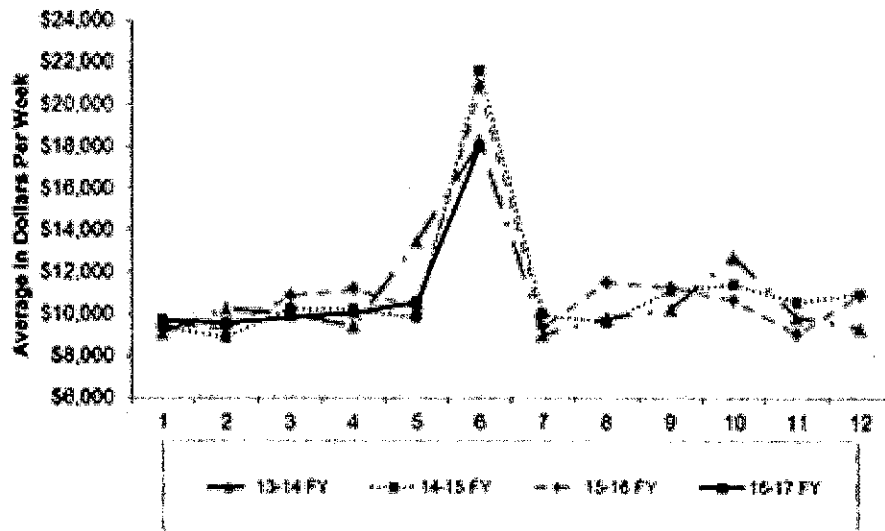

Quilters Corner

Each month we tie 25 quilts that help to warm the hearts and bodies of those who are cold in our own nearby communities. EACH month we use a total of 137 yards of fabric to sew together the pieced tops, another 137 yards of fabric for the backings and another 50 yards of batting to complete these 25 quilts. Add to that, the spools of thread to sew the tops together and the 50 skeins of floss to tie the tops to finish them! Now if you multiply all of those numbers times the 10 times we meet each year, that is how much raw material goes into the making of 250 quilts by the Quilt Ministry at COK. The labors of love that go in to this effort cannot be measured.

If this is something that you would like to be a part of, we have many opportunities for you to take advantage of. Sewing at home at your convenience? Yes, we need you! Scouting garage sales for sheets? We need that, too! Donations of fabric from your personal "stash", floss and thread...or JoAnn's gift cards? Also much needed. Showing up to help tie quilts on the days that we finish the quilts? We'd LOVE to see you! Stop in on Tuesday, February 21 any time between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. in the Family Life Center and we will welcome you with open hands and warm smiles.

We've all heard that stewardship is giving to the church of our time, talents, and treasure. This alliterative trinity helps us see that giving is not just about money, but about our whole lives. For God has given us everything we have and enjoy as we confess in the meaning to the First Article of the Apostles' Creed. And what we confess first among those is that God gives us "our body and soul, our eyes, ears, and all our members, our reason and all our senses." Only then do we confess that He gives us material things. Thus the time, talents, and treasure trinity places before our eyes the fact that we are to give something of all of these things toward the mission of the church in thanksgiving for what God has provided. For everything we have and indeed everything we are comes from God's fatherly divine goodness and mercy.



Stewardship Corner

The problem with this alliterative trinity comes when we replace one little word with another little word—when we replace the word *and* with the word *or*. It is always written with the *and*, but when we read it, we read it with the *or*. Thus this quite helpful trinity, which extolled that everything that we have and are is a gift from God which is to be pressed into the service of God in His church, turns into a trinity that we can pick and choose which of the trinity we use into the service of God. The giving of our time, talents, *and* treasure turns into the giving of our time, talents, *or* treasure.

Then the question arises: Can we give of our time and talents instead of our treasures? Or perhaps it is the other way round: Can we give our treasure and not of our time and our talents? But these are the wrong questions. The right question is, can we give of our time and our talents in addition to our treasure? Yes, indeed, we are called to give of all three. The things that God gives us are not to be pitted against one another. They are given to us and we are to press them all into God's service for benefit of His church and our neighbors in need.

Thus we give all three. We give our treasure in the form of a generous, first-fruits, proportion of our income. We give of our time in generosity for the benefit of Christ's holy church. We give of our talents in the same manner. Since God gave us all these things, we are called to give generously of all these things in faith toward Him and in fervent love to our neighbors.

For God has provided all these things to us. Out of His fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, He gives us each time, talents, *AND* treasures as a means to bless those around us. We serve our neighbors with these things, blessing them with the blessings in which God has blessed us. We give of our time, talents, and treasures to our families, our society, and to our church, our local congregations. And we do this because we know that we are not our own. Rather, we belong to God. We have been bought with a price—with the holy precious blood and innocent suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. He gave everything—His time, His talents, and His treasure,—to have us as His own and to live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence and blessedness. We have these things as gifts and blessings from God. Let us then press them all into service for the sake of His love—time, talents, and treasures together.



Strategic Planning

The Strategic Planning Committee has progressed to the identification of the following 6 initiatives/objectives that are a result of our cottage meeting feedback and planning committee dialogue. We are excited to explore and plan for these initiatives to improve our mission of glorifying God through Worship, His Word, our Witness, and His Work. These six initiatives and objectives are:

1. Evaluation of worship with the objective of achieving excellence in Worship
2. Building community in Jesus with the objective of developing strong, caring relationships within the church body

I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God and is by faith. I want to know Christ and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in His sufferings, becoming like Him in His death, and so, somehow, to attain the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus. Philippians 3:7-14

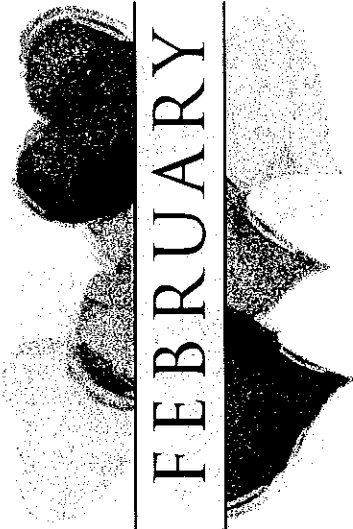
