### **“Two Sides to This Issue!”**

Recently I saw a post on Facebook where parents were debating the pros and cons of athletics. Specifically they were debating that sports practices, training, and games never seem to stop, not even for summer vacations. Many of the sports that our young people are involved in today have become a year round endeavor and not even Sunday mornings are exempt.

Being a pastor in Saline, this topic immediately caught my interest. I don't write on Facebook, but I certainly am impacted by this subject. Being a pastor, a parent, a grandparent, a former teacher and a coach (girls basketball for ten years,) I know there are two sides to this issue.

First, I side with those who are frustrated. As a pastor and teacher of the faith who works with our young people, I often feel I am at the bottom of the food chain. Like it or not sports schedules and practices almost always take precedent over what we are trying to do at church. I can get angry about it, I can rant against it, but I know that will accomplish nothing. I know children and parents are also caught in the middle of this. Here at church we try our best to be understanding and to provide options to accomplish confirmation and other church activities. Each year I ask parents at the beginning of confirmation to treat me with the same respect they give coaches. But often that means that I must make some kind of compromise.

Personally, I left coaching even though I was very successful at it. Why? Because many were sending their children to our school because of our athletic program rather than the academics and the spiritual dimension we brought to our students. Even then, as a physical education major, I could see that sports, for as much good as it accomplishes, were way out of balance.

It began to monopolize more and more time from not only the young athlete but also their family. Many times to the detriment of their family and their spiritual well-being. As a former athlete myself who was pressured to by my peers to play every sport, I lost the joy and the fun of just playing the game.

What's the answer to this side of the argument? I'm not telling anyone to quit participating in sports. But the wisest advice I could give would be to remember what the Bible says. It speaks of doing things in moderation. Doing things in moderation means praying about it and making choices. God also tells us that it is of the utmost importance to keep our priorities straight. Part of that is always keeping Him first in our lives and activities. We must ask ourselves if our activities and choices are causing God to be moved out of first place?

Secondly, training is important. My son's cross county coach wrote to him before school was out and encouraged him to keep up his summer training program. The coach had set goals for him and the team. The coach cared about him and the team. As a pastor of this church I immediately thought about the spiritual lesson we can draw from this.

Athletes compete, they strive for the gold so to speak. As Christians we also have our eyes fixed on the finish line. We don't strive for a perishable medal. Instead we are called to keep our eyes of faith fixed on Jesus, the very "author and perfecter of our faith." Heaven is a gift won for us by our Savior. But you are fooling yourself if you don't believe there are forces and opponents like the devil, the world, and our sinful flesh who want you to fail. What a tragedy when so many Christians don't take care of their spiritual well-being. This happens especially during the summer when it is tempting to stay away from church and God's Word. What's the answer? Train, exercise, practice! Build your spiritual muscles. Keep focused on the Word of God. Athletes literally live for the events that they will compete in. Should our response and commitment to Christ bring forth any less of a response?

Remember to rely upon the guidance from the ultimate strength coach, God the Holy Spirit. And remember God has a plan and a purpose for your life and mine.

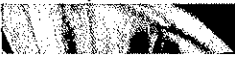

## Help Needed



**Help Is Needed!** That's what happens when someone from Christ Our King passes away and a funeral meal is prepared. Many of you are familiar with the need that our church has when a meal is prepared for the loved ones that attend the funeral/memorial service. But many of you are not. Here's a brief outline of what we as members of our church do:

1. **Prayers** are always said for the family and friends of the one who has died and that the church will respond to show the love of Jesus to those grieving.
  2. An estimate of the number of people who will probably attend the meal is made by the family, the pastor, and the funeral home director.
  3. **An announcement** is made to the congregation (or an email is sent) asking for help to supply the foods needed.
    - ❖ **Donations** of potatoes, vegetables, salads, and desserts are usually needed.
    - ❖ The congregation is also asked to **help set up** tables and chairs, set the tables with tablecloths and flowers, get the serving tables ready with hot-pads, serving utensils, plates, napkins, silverware, etc.,
    - ❖ **help to serve** the food and beverages while the guests are eating,
    - ❖ and **help to clean up**, which includes clearing off all tables, putting all the tablecloths away, washing and drying dishes, packaging up all leftover food for the family to take, putting everything used away, sweeping the floor, and leaving the FLC just like it was before the preparations began.
  4. Supplies are checked on at the church and more purchased, if needed.
  5. Ham or chicken is ordered to be picked up the day of the meal along with rolls, butter, cream, etc., to complete the meal.
  6. Some help is needed 2-1/2 hours before the meal to prepare the ham, beverages, cut up desserts, and other last minute things to make the dinner run smoothly.
  7. One of our pastors always comes in to lead us in prayer for the family and ask that our work would show the love of Christ to the people we're serving.
- ❖ Do those of us helping always know the person who has passed away? No.
  - ❖ Do we want to show God's love to anyone who attends the service and the meal? By all means!
  - ❖ Is there a lot of preparation that goes into serving a funeral meal? Yes, by many people! AND, many hands make light work!
  - ❖ Will you consider helping in some way the next time you see "HELP IS NEEDED!" for a funeral/ memorial meal? Thanks so much!
  - ❖ And, finally, thanks to all of you who have so generously prepared and donated food and/or given of your time in some way to serve our grieving guests at Christ Our King!

### *Do you enjoy helping a friend and/or family with a meal?*

Occasionally we have members at Christ Our King who encounter situations when some meals would be an excellent gift. Perhaps they are recovering from surgery or an accident, or have a member of the family in the hospital, or a new baby.

Sue Colvia has volunteered to set up a **Meal Train** account when meals would be helpful for someone in the congregation.

*This is how it works.* When told of a possible family to help, Sue will contact them and get information about the number of people in the family, how long meals would be need, and any dietary concerns. Then Sue will establish a **Meal Train** account online for the family. She will email or text people who have expressed interest in providing meals in times of need and an e-mail will be sent from the Church office with links to follow. The message will include the *online address for the family's meal train*. This information will also be included on Christ Our King's Facebook page.

Don't like to cook or you don't have time to cook but you still want to help? You can also sign up to purchase restaurant gift cards. For example, sign up for a day of pizza. Call the restaurant with the family's order, pay with your credit card, and have it delivered to them.

Those who receive the emails or texts can go online to the family's meal train account, and sign up for a time when they can provide a meal.

# LWML

Here is a summary of the LWML Spring Rally held on April 29, 2017. Ten ladies from Christ Our King carpooled to Concordia's School of Nursing on Plymouth Road to join about 75 other women from LWML societies. We were welcomed by VP Beth DeMeritt and also by Curt Gielow, VP of Administration of the School of Nursing.

Opening devotions were led by Rev. Ryan Peterson. A brief business meeting followed. Our guest speaker was Cindy Fenske, Dean of the School of Nursing. She is a graduate of Valparaiso University followed by many years of being an instructor in the Healthcare field at U of M.

Dean Fenske detailed the history of acquiring the building to be used as the School of Nursing and continually gave God the credit as this process unfolded. Another topic she spoke about was the renewal of the interior of the building to meet present needs of the upcoming School of Nursing. She gave a description of exam rooms duplicated as in a regular hospital setting. Dummies and models representing patients on which to practice were found in most of the hospital beds. Ailments of dummies are controlled by "behind the scene" instructors. Students are to diagnose and treat their conditions. The dummies are made to electronically respond and, if necessary, the students are to make adjustments in their treatment plan. We toured classrooms with "state of art" electronic equipment. A medical lab is also part of the facility. There is a complete one floor, one bedroom house plan - replica of the home a patient may return to and how adjustments may need to be made for their comfort.

Other fields of health care are on the horizon; some already in practice and others to be introduced later. These are: chiropractic, physical therapy, doctor practitioner, psychology, education, athletic training, and social work. Following our experiences at the School of Nursing, we drove to Concordia's campus on Geddes Road and enjoyed a brunch buffet in their cafeteria. We thank God for this pleasurable experience and for the people who work in the medical field. Our own Alyssa Meister is a student in this program!

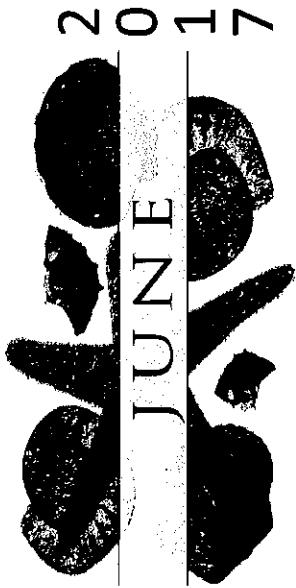

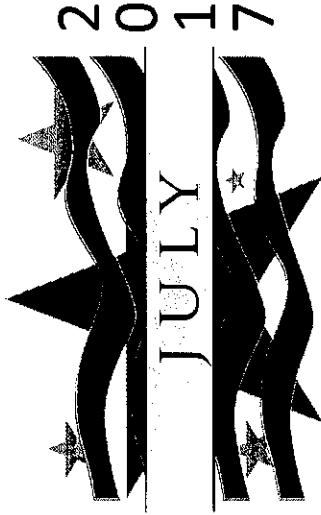
