Spring — An Opportune Time!

As I write this, the days are getting longer and the calendar tells us that it is spring. That makes me think of plowing, planting, and growing. Farmers know, after years of experience, that a single week's delay in planting (beyond the earliest possible date) can result in a 30% loss in the crops; two weeks delay can bring a 40% loss; and four weeks delay 50%. Of course that's not always the case depending upon the weather, but the point is clear: The earliest sowing always yields the heaviest harvest.

We as Christians are concerned about another form of planting and another harvest. We are concerned about sowing and planting the seeds of God's Word beginning with our children. The Bible makes it clear, "Train up a child in the way they shall go and when the are old they will not depart from it." (Proverbs 22:6) Childhood is the time to begin planting and the sooner we start the better.

In recent years Christian Education, worship, and Sunday school attendance has rapidly declined across our nation. Many churches no longer offer Vacation Bible School or Sunday School as an option. Last year we had one hundred visitors attend Vacation Bible School along with thirty-five of our own members. That's awesome! While we are happy to have them and we could pat ourselves on the back we are also facing challenges in our ministry. Currently less than 50% of our own children attend Sunday school on a weekly basis. Many of those same children are not in church either. Why is this? Some tell me that it's just not all that important or that our Sunday school is not first class. Then there is the ever-present competition on Sunday mornings with sports, vacations, sleep, etc.

I'll admit that I didn't face some of the challenges that parents do today when I was raising my children, nevertheless, I know that we have only one opportunity at this. We are always looking at ways to improve and grow our ministry and

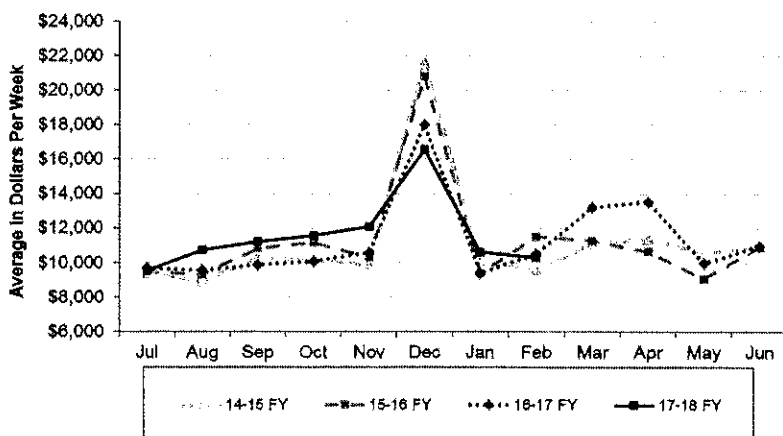

Our Father in heaven sent His Son, Jesus, to be our Savior. His atoning sacrifice is the first fruits of all the dead, a pleasing aroma to His Father – and

ours – so that His perfect life and death count for all who believe in Him.

He claimed us as His own children in Holy Baptism. He sustains and strengthens our faith with His Holy Word and His Body and Blood. As new creatures, who have put on Christ, we bear good fruit. We do the good works prepared for us, which He makes known to us in His Word.

By faith then, trusting in the Word of God, we do what He says because He does not lie and always keeps His promises. For “without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him” (Heb. 11:6).

And so the Lord promises: “Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first fruits of all your produce; then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine” (Prov. 3:9-10).

How do we honor the Lord with the wealth that God has given us in His generosity? By giving it generously to those whom the Lord has called us to love and support: your family, your society, and your church. And His promise is that in so doing, you will never lack.

I can almost hear it now: “But that’s from the Old Testament!” But our Lord Jesus Himself gives us similar promises in the New Testament. He says, at the conclusion of the parable of the talents, “For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance” (Matt. 25:29).

And then at the end of the parable of the dishonest manager, he says: “One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. If then you have not been faithful in the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful in that which is another’s, who will give you that which is your own? No servant can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money” (Luke 16:10–13).

And in His sermon on the mount, he says: “Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also” (Matt. 6:19–21).
