Connect Guide

Discuss:

- 1. What do you do when your faith gets challenged? When you hold onto the promise of God but it feels like God's promise doesn't come true? Do you worry? Do you lapse into fear? Do you give up?
- 2. Take a look at Luke 11:1-16. What is Jesus' relationship with Mary, Martha and Lazarus? Do you know anything else about these real-life people? What happened to Lazarus in this section of the Bible story? What is the response of Jesus, the disciples and the sisters?
- 3. Jesus arrives on the scene in verse 17 (late by human standards). In the following verses, what human emotions and expressions do we see displayed in each person? What action or response does Jesus repeatedly reinforce with Martha and Mary? When do we tend to second-guess God?
- 4. Did things go according to plan in the lives of Mary, Martha and Lazarus? When have you thought you had a better plan for your life than God? How in our setbacks, does God get to display his power and glory? How have you seen God's power and glory displayed this past week?
- 5. Even when your faith is challenged, how do you know Jesus remains faithful? Look up the following scriptures. Proverbs 3:5-6; Psalm 27; Matthew 14: 22-31. How do these verses encourage your faith journey?
