LOCATION

Calvary Christian School, a ministry of Calvary Baptist Church has been providing quality Christian education since 1974. CCS's 63 acre campus is located on Taylor Mill Rd. about 4 miles south of the I-275 loop. Students come from Neighboring Kentucky counties, southwestern Ohio and southeastern Indiana.

FACILITY

The campus houses the elementary, middle and high schools. It includes a library, a gymnasium, two computer labs, a cafeteria, 2 soccer fields, 2 baseball fields and a playground. There are two entrances to the school property: one off of Taylor Mill Road and one off of Hands Pike. The school has three parking lots. A separate Pre-school school house is on the property.

SCHOOL SYSTEM

Calvary Christian School has students in grade K3 – 12. Total enrollment is approximately 400 with about 190 of those being middle and high school students. Approximately 56 faculty and staff, spread out over three divisions: elementary school (K3-6) middle school (7-8) and high school (9-12). Faculty members have at least a bachelor's degree and are ACSI certified; over half have earned a Master's degree.

STUDENT ACADEMIC LOAD

The Middle and High School at CCS are on a modified A/B Block schedule. Each student attends 4 to 5 classes per day. They take 7 to 8 classes per year and can earn up to 8 credits per year. Some students may take a study hall. Each student can plan on 1 to 2 hours of homework a night. Students must remain at school the whole day. Special permission may be granted for Juniors and Seniors who opt to enroll in a dual credit program through a college or university. Dual credit classes are also available on site at CCS.

DUAL CREDIT

Students can take college courses on campus, off campus, and online for both high school and college credit.

ONLINE ACADEMY

Students can enroll full time or part time in our accredited online academy.
