SECOND LESSON

A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Philippians

3:4b-14

If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be

found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

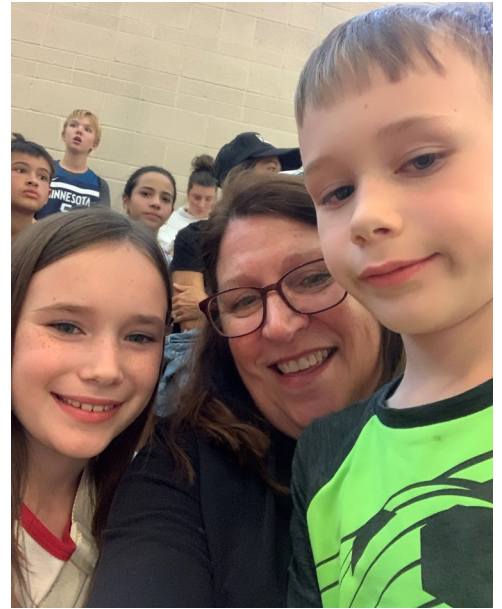

A REFLECTION FROM CHAPLAIN ERIN

“For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:
a time to be born, and a time to die;
a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;
a time to kill, and a time to heal;
a time to break down, and a time to build up;
a time to weep, and a time to laugh;
a time to mourn, and a time to dance;
a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together;
a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;
a time to seek, and a time to lose;
a time to keep, and a time to throw away;
a time to tear, and a time to sew;
a time to keep silence, and a time to speak;
a time to love, and a time to hate;
a time for war, and a time for peace.”

- Ecclesiastes 3:1-8



This might be the best-known passage in Ecclesiastes. (On a random note, Ecclesiastes is the hardest book to spell.) Thanks to the song by the Byrds, most people my age can easily sing this verse. "Turn! Turn! Turn!", also known as "To Everything There Is a Season," was written by Pete Seeger in 1959. Great things happened in 1959.

The passage talks about how God has created time for everything. God also designed a world where we can embrace both sides of any issue. There is a time for this and a time for that. I find myself living with this truth right now.

My grandchildren came for a visit. It was their spring break but not mine. My son's business partner, as well as his beloved mother-in-law, sparked the visit. That makes Jennifer not only my friend but the other grandmother. I am blessed to share this relationship with her! Jennifer offered to take the kids as a 40th birthday gift to my son Ryan, so he could go to New Zealand with his wife. She was in Australia on a business trip and was also excited to visit New Zealand.

This long setup leads me to my story. Over the last ten days, I have had the kids several times. Emily is ten and in the 4th Grade. Teddy is six and in the 1st Grade. They live in Pennsylvania, but we see them several times yearly because both grandmothers live here. They have a room at my house with their own beds and a closet full of their things. They feel quite at home here.

While with me, they swam in the pool, played basketball on the next-door neighbor's hoop, watched Bluey on TV, ate waffles every morning, drank half a gallon of milk, and consumed an untold number of peanut butter and jelly sandwiches.

We gathered with all the Oneys. We gathered with all the Oneys and the Caughlins. We spent the night with our cousins. We ate at their favorite restaurants. We went to a Spring Training Game. We did all the things!

I loved spending time with them! At the same time, when they left to go home, every muscle in my body ached. I was emotionally and physically exhausted. Their visit delighted me when they came and when they left. Both. Glory to God for giving me both the gift of grandchildren and the gift of quiet when they leave.

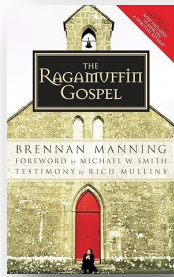
