



Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.



Even though some of you may already know me, I'd like to introduce myself. I'm The Very Rev. Troy Mendez, and I served in Arizona for the past ten years as dean of Trinity Cathedral in downtown Phoenix. On February 1, I formally concluded my ministry at Trinity and began serving the greater church as the Executive Director of the Episcopal Evangelism Society (EES), an organization that has supported the mission and ministry of the Episcopal Church since 1862. I also serve on the boards of Virginia Theological Seminary and the General Seminary of the Episcopal Church. From time to time, you may see me in Sunday and weekday worship services, and I look forward to being a support and a resource to this community as All Saints and the Episcopal Church look with anticipation to loving God and our neighbors in ways in which we have still yet to fully imagine or realize.

Lent is a holy time, a time of reconnecting with God and with one another. It is my hope that our journey with Jesus over this season will continue to bring forth that good work that all of you are doing together to advance the Kingdom of God, both now and for many years to come.

Ministry Spotlight: Prison Ministry

I have to make a confession, I have never thought of myself as the ministry type. Before the prison ministry, I had never been involved in extracurricular church activities. I only knew a few people in the congregation and I had no inclination to do more than attend service on Sunday (sporadically). What I have discovered is there is no ministry type. We are all called, as Christians, to serve others. I have come to believe I was called to this ministry, and perhaps that makes perfect sense because my father spent time in prison when I was a child.

I still remember the long drive to Florence to visit my Dad, the Circle K on the corner of the road that led to the prison where my Mom would buy us a snack, the officers waving a wand over my 8-year-old body to check for weapons, and the vending machine in the prison visiting room. I also recall how lost I felt when I watched my father emerge from behind the heavy metal door in



his prison uniform, and the helplessness that filled me when the metal door clanged shut behind him because our visit was over. Friends would ask me, "Where is your father?" That question filled me with shame that didn't belong to me because I couldn't answer. I know that those who are incarcerated and those who wait for them to come home are my family, and I have found that they are All Saints' family too.

A few weeks ago during his sermon Father Perry asked everyone who had participated in the Prison Ministry to stand and be recognized and virtually the entire congregation stood up together. In that moment, I realized something, that as we seek to bless these women and their families, we too are blessed.

Every time someone acts in kindness for the incarcerated and their families I imagine a little ripple of love is sent into the universe. If that is true, I know that our congregation is making waves. It is beautiful to watch people find ways to support this ministry. Whether they are collecting yarn from their friends and neighbors so the women at Perryville have supplies to crochet beanies for the homeless, or selecting the perfect Christmas gift for an Angel Tree child, our hearts are committed because we know what we contribute to others matters.

Nine years ago, our prison ministry began as seven women sat together in my home, writing Mother's Day cards. We didn't have any expectations about what would happen next, but we wanted the women to know that they had not been forgotten. That first month, we wrote cards until our hands were cramped, and we resolved to meet every month to write birthday cards and welcome anyone who wanted to join us. By the time we started writing Christmas cards (in August), we had a crowd of people around the conference table in St. Barbara writing on cards donated by our congregation and mailing them with donated stamps. When we were given the opportunity to serve, we stepped up with grace, and we have written thousands of Christmas, Mother's Day, and birthday cards to the women at Perryville. The enthusiasm to serve wasn't isolated to writing cards, though; every single time our community is given a chance to serve, we have done it with gusto.

When we learned that the women at Perryville were released from prison without proper shoes, we donated hundreds of pairs of shoes. When we discovered how much unmet need there was in our Angel Tree families, we rallied to fill back-to-school backpacks and provide gift cards to caregivers at Christmas time so they could buy a Christmas tree or provide their families with a proper Christmas meal. And, when we discovered that women were released from prison and dropped off at a bus stop to navigate their first day of freedom alone, we stepped in and offered them a ride.

Our extended parish family now includes grandparents raising their grandchildren while the mothers serve their time. Children, traumatized by all of it, struggle to make sense of what never will make sense to them. And the artists whose artwork is on exhibit in St. Barbara. Every one of them could teach a master class in resilience and we've shown up to learn.

The prison ministry has grown because of the love and generosity of our community and now we have been called to do more. Our rector has determined to set his sights and ours on making All Saints' the prison ministry hub for the Episcopal Diocese of Arizona and we have a congregation that can make that happen. I cannot wait to see what is in store for us! Let's go Team All Saints'!
