### **We're glad you're with us today!**

We welcome you to All Saints'. If you are new to us, we hope you will introduce yourself to our clergy after the service.

All Saints' is an active church with a pre-K through 8<sup>th</sup> grade day school. As an Episcopal church and school, we are part of the Episcopal Diocese of Arizona, The Episcopal Church (TEC), and the worldwide Anglican Communion. All Saints' is a vibrant, diverse community with a wide range of views—united in our commitment to follow Christ as we pray, learn, and serve together. In so doing, we connect with each other, with God, and with those in need.

At the heart of all that we do is our worship of God. Page numbers in the order of service refer to the red Book of Common Prayer and hymns are in the blue Hymnal 1982. We experience the real presence of Christ in the bread and wine of our Holy Communion, and we invite all baptized Christians from any Christian church or tradition to eat and drink at the Eucharistic feast with us. Children are active participants in our community, and baptized children are welcome to receive communion (for information on baptism, call the Church Office).

Wherever you are in your journey of faith, we hope you will feel the loving, transforming presence of God here. If you are looking for a church home, we invite you to get to know us better. You may fill out a visitor card in the pew and put it in the collection basin at the offertory, or speak with a hospitality volunteer or clergy person. READING FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT  
AMOS 7:7-15

This is what the Lord God showed me: the Lord was standing beside a wall built with a plumb line, with a plumb line in his hand. And the Lord said to me, "Amos, what do you see?" And I said, "A plumb line." Then the Lord said, "See, I am setting a plumb line in the midst of my people Israel; I will never again pass them by; the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate, and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword." Then Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, sent to King Jeroboam of Israel, saying, "Amos has conspired against you in the very center of the house of Israel; the land is not able to bear all his words. For thus Amos has said, 'Jeroboam shall die by the sword, and Israel must go into exile away from his land.'" And Amaziah said to Amos, "O seer, go, flee away to the land of Judah, earn your bread there, and prophesy there; but never again prophesy at Bethel, for it is the king's sanctuary, and it is a temple of the kingdom." 
