### A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

10:34-43

Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. THE HOLY GOSPEL JOHN 20:1-18

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John **People:** Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes. But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

THE NICENE CREED

We pray for those who suffer pain and anguish, and all who are sick or in any need: Grant them the faith to reach out towards the healing wounds of Christ and be filled with his peace. Risen Lord: **In your glory, hear us.** 

We pray for all those who have died in the hope of the resurrection, for those whose faith is known to you alone, for those who have died in war or through natural disaster, and for all those in whose memory Easter flowers have been given: Unite us with them in your undying love. Risen Lord: **In your glory, hear us.** 

### Celebrant:

God of Life, who for our redemption gave your only-begotten Son to the death of the cross, and by his glorious resurrection have delivered us from the power of our enemy: hear the prayers of your people, and grant that we may evermore live with him in the joy of his risen life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**


### PRESENTATION HYMN



# A Musical Note from Tom, our Director of Music



During Communion, you may recognize a familiar tune — or two. The tune we typically remember as "Good King Wenceslas" was actually first printed in 1582 with a Latin poem, "Tempus adest floridum" about Springtime, renewal, and the divine artist behind it all. It wasn't until much later (1853) that the Christmas story of Good King Wenceslas was paired to the tune; today, we sing the original words translated into English.

Paired with that tune (layered on top of it!) is another song we associate with Christmas — "Ding dong merrily on high". This tune is also very old (1589), and was written in a book of dance tunes with no lyrics at all. Centuries later, in 1924, the carol as we know it was published.

So one might think of this joyful, jaunty piece, "Tempus adest floridum", as a springtime Easter frolic through two misplaced Christmas carols.

We also offer a beautiful movement from a Bach cantata at Communion, "Friede sei mit euch"— Peace be with you. Some may remember that at Christmas, the Choir sang Bach's setting of the angels' tidings: "Glory to God in the highest, and peace on earth to men of good will." In that piece, the musical contrast between "glory" and "peace" is striking, both in tempo (speed) and the instruments he uses (strings vs. winds). In today's piece, he uses a very similar contrast, and since this piece was written much earlier (it was first performed April 16, 1724 — 300 years ago nearly to the day!), I like to think that this piece informed how we later set those famous words at Christmas.
